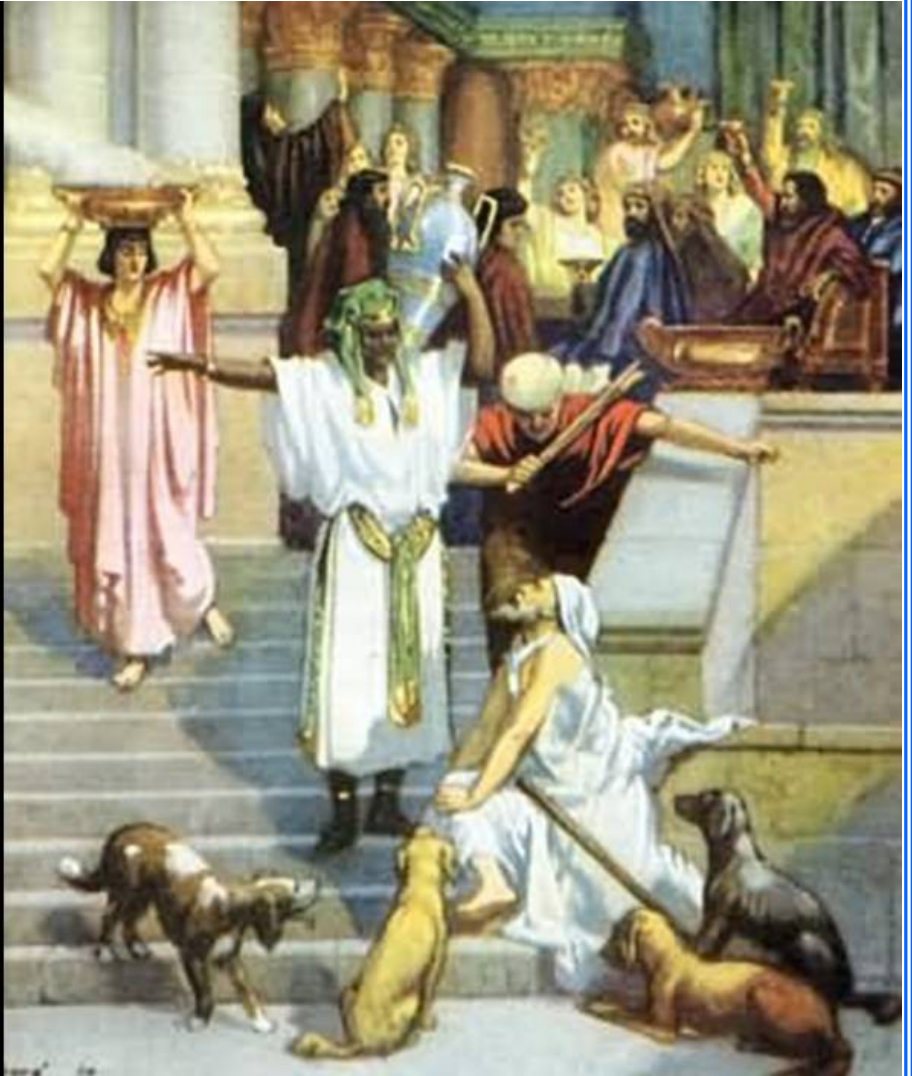

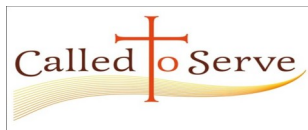

**Deacon's Corner****September 25, 2022**St. Jerome

This coming week we celebrate the feast day of St. Jerome on Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>. Most saints are remembered for some outstanding virtue or devotion, which they practice, but Jerome is frequently remembered for his bad temper. Jerome was born to wealthy Christian parents in 331 in Striden. This town was in the Latin-speaking Roman province of Dalmatia, a part of modern Yugoslavia. He studied under some of the best teachers of his time in Rome and later in Trier, Germany.

While in Rome, Jerome pursued the many pleasures of life. At the same time, he would visit the crypt in Rome and imagine himself in hell. Eventually, through the strong Christian influences of a close companion Bonosus he changed his ways for the better. Jerome decided to become a Christian and was baptized by Pope Liberius. He would serve as a secretary for Pope Damasus. The Pope supported St Jerome against his critics who disagreed with his rigor and type of asceticism. After the pontiff died in 384, Jerome decided to take a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, where he stayed until he died in 420. His body is now buried in the Basilica of St. Mary Major in Rome.

Through his studies, Jerome became a master in Latin, Greece, Hebrew, and Chaldaic. This served him well during his 20-year project translating the Bible into the vulgate (the common language) or Latin. This opened up the Scriptures to a much wider audience. Through this work and many of Jerome's writings, he is recognized as one of the four original doctors of the Western Church, along with St. Ambrose, St. Augustine, and St. Gregory the Great.

Jerome was a man of explosive temperament with an uncontrollable, nasty tongue. He had the virtues and unpleasant fruits of being a fearless critic and all the usual moral problems of a man. He was swift to anger but also quick to feel remorse. The wonderful thing we can learn from St. Jerome is that even saints are imperfect. We all need God's gifts of love and grace and can achieve the essential tasks that God has for us through those graces.

St. Jerome prayed for our shortcomings as you prayed for your own.
