FAITH IN ACTION

Today's scriptures are situated in the midst of a long lesson on the vocation of discipleship. Over the last several weeks we have heard about our calling to be humble, to detach ourselves from worldly possessions, to give and receive forgiveness, and to care for those in need. In the next two weeks we will hear about our calling to give thanks in all things and to persevere in faithfulness until the end.

This Sunday our attention is focused on the gift of faith, a gift that is meant not to be put on a shelf, but to be put into action. Habakkuk offers us a good example. He believes that God will answer prayers and intervene on behalf of the suffering. He puts this faith into action in the form of an urgent plea to God, and receives a vision that his faith will surely be rewarded. In the Gospel, the image of faith the size of a mustard seed illustrates the power of faith well used. The story of the faithful servants reminds us that putting our faith into action is an essential requirement of the vocation of discipleship.

"STIR INTO FLAME THE GIFT YOU HAVE FROM GOD"

The Spirit has many means of enkindling and tending the flame of faith within us-nature, life experiences, our Christian companions, the sacraments, the scriptures, Church teaching, and the life of service. We are indeed blessed to receive such a gift. Yet that precious flame can fade into a mere ember unless we stoke it into a blazing fire from which others can derive warmth and light. The reading from Timothy encourages us to put our faith into action "with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us" (2 Timothy 1:14). The Spirit will increase not only our faith, but our "power and love and self-control" (2 Timothy 1:7) when we respond to the Christian vocation to put the gift of faith into action.

Dear Friends in Christ:

October and May are set aside in the Catholic Church as being special months of Mary. In addition, October is noted as being "Respect Life Month." As a Church, we have foundational beliefs about our ministry in the world. We have a special calling to speak out in defense of victims and in opposition to

perpetrators, stalkers, political forces who abuse others in order to establish more power and financial influence over our culture.

A lot of people speak up to save the lives of the unborn, and we are all called to be more sensitive to the ways in which we can support that movement! Yet, Respect Life also targets having a plan to care for those who are born into poverty, with handicaps, or who are abused and victimized because of their ethnic identities, gender, color, or other characteristic that reflects the prejudice of others rather than any failure on their own part.

People may be different from others, but that is not an excuse to treat them badly! In the beginning, before we messed up, it was God's intention that all are created equally human! Depersonalizing people dehumanizes them, objectifies them according to a handicap or failure and allows for treating them badly and not feeling there is anything wrong with that. Jesus was criticized for eating with 'sinners, prostitutes, thieves' therefore He must be one of them! Mother Theresa hobbled along the narrow roads of Calcutta with beggars, leprous, the 'poorest of the poor.' She chose to associate with them, to lift them up, to give them hope within their own hostile environment. Jesus did the same, and he sent his disciples to do so also.

Exactly what do parents do to help their children to "respect life" within their school and activities environments? What devotion would prayerfully help us to become more sensitive to the victims of abuse? What charitable organization do we know that reaches out to the poor and hungry? Do we have canes, walkers, wheel chairs that are not being used that others would sincerely appreciate? What specific action can a person of Faith do to express his and her Respect for human life this month? Perhaps by participating in the Rosary March for Life is a good devotional statement to make. Perhaps doing a personal 'holy hour' before the Blessed Sacrament or praying a rosary at our Marian Shrine would be a nice family gathering experience or visit the Respect Life monument in front of our church and pray there for so many victims of neglect. Do something.


