

# From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

Last July I visited for the first time the Flight 93 Memorial and Museum near Shanksville, which as we all know was the site – 21 years ago this weekend – of one of the three horrific terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. I have been to our nation's capital since that infamous day, but did not venture near the Pentagon. I too have visited Manhattan in the past two decades, but could not go near Ground Zero, where the Twin Towers once stood, and as I mentioned last year my cousin Mary Ann died that fateful day. So going to Shanksville this summer, accompanied by Father Mark Groeger, was an extraordinary and spiritual experience. I will have to go back again, because one cannot grasp everything with just one visit.



At the memorial, there are large magnificent slabs of marble, just a few feet away from the actual crash site, which, of course, is also a cemetery, and on the marble are engraved the names of all the victims of the plane crash. One in particular caught my eye immediately. I offer the image to you in this column. Two victims: a mother, Lauren Catuzzi Grandcolas; and her unborn child! Notice that the unborn child's nameless engraving is not as dark as the mother's name! Why is this child on the womb not exacted the same privilege as his mother? Both were alive at the time of the crash. I will touch on this in my homily this weekend.

On this September 11<sup>th</sup> – let us recommit ourselves not only to peace in our troubled world – to end to all forms of hatred, division, persecution, prejudice, religious intolerance, and violence; but also to a DAILY – a daily – consistent commitment to praying for the sanctity of all human life from the very moment of conception until God calls our soul home at a natural death.

I have copied a beautiful Litany for Life in the bulletin today on the rose colored legal sheet of paper. Take it home – take it to work – take it to school – take it to church and pray it. Yes, pray it every day. I thank the Diocese of Covington, KY, who included this litany in their diocesan newspaper. I am glad to share it with you, along with this consecration prayer. Pray it too – daily!

#### ACT OF CONSECRATION TO MARY, THE MOTHER OF LIFE

O Mary, Queen of Heaven and earth, Mother of the Word Incarnate, and our most loving Mother, God willed to entrust the Author of Life to your most loving heart. As a community of faith, we come before you sinful and sorrowful for the ways in which we have failed to love God and our neighbor as we ought. We cast ourselves at your feet, humbly imploring that you aid us through your Immaculate Heart to uphold the dignity of every human person from the very moment of their conception, until God Himself calls them home through natural death. To you, O Mary, the Mother of Life, we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that hatred and discord may end, and faith, hope, and love spread throughout our community. It was through your "Yes" to the will of God that you became the Mother of Life. We trust that through your Immaculate Heart, all life will once more be upheld as beautiful.

To you we consecrate the future of the Church, especially her children, our needs and expectations, our anxieties, our hopes and joys. Through your intercession, may the love and mercy of God be poured out upon the earth. May you on whom the Holy Spirit descended, restore among us the unity and harmony that comes from God. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster a growth in the awareness of the beauty and the splendor of every life. Obtain for us, we pray, the grace of conversion of heart and growth in holiness. Amen.

All life is holy – all life is precious – all life if from God!

May He bless you abundantly this week!
