



From the Pastor's Desk

LIVING UP TO THE NAME OF GOD: The Second Commandment

Ten Commandments Summer Series Part II of X

My dear parish family:



My grandfather knew everybody!! Moreover, everyone in return knew him. One random day many years ago, he was preparing to cross a street in Chicago one of America's then and now largest and busiest cities. There in a sea of humanity with cars whizzing by a voice shouts from across the street: "HEY! Joe Pino!!" Leave it to my Pap to be in a random place at a random time and someone knew his name! It just goes to show there's a lot in a name.

Living the second commandment requires more than just refraining for curse words or swearing, which in our society today is common parlance, especially on television and while driving! (I'm guilty of this all the time – mea culpa!!) As is true of the other commandments (remember not suggestions), it moves us in a direction of life. Because God has initiated a relationship with all of humanity, we are now members of a community, a faith community that's works to achieve its

purpose as it practices what it preaches. More than one Christian and even non-Christian for that matter who has remarked on the ability of the Church to influence society and better shape our overall view upon humanity – our problems and hopefully some solutions too. THERE IS MORE WORK TO DO!

Every age throughout history needs, I dare say must be required, to embrace God's gift of self and respond to His invitation, this is why society – the Church – humanity as a whole is constantly in the flux of rebirth – changing – reinventing itself to do better. We need to teach our young people (and probably remind ourselves in the process) that God is holy and so are we (we forget that component many times); we need to align our actions with our faith and not the other way around. Yes, we must become witnesses to a love than can chase away verbal, physical, mental and spiritual abuse of others. The second commandment is not archaic or something that an archaeologist digging in the dirt would uncover and declare obsolete; rather it is a testament – proof – to the power of words and the relationships that can be deepened through a thoughtful stance in all we say and do. And that takes patience, brains and heart!

There is a saying: "Easier said than done." Much of our daily activities are built on trusting another person's words. A neighbor agrees to pick up your kids at school. A person of business agrees – first in words, then in writing – to provide a product or service under contractual conditions. To engage in honest and fruitful conversation is to uncover – reveal – part of ourselves (whether it be pretty or not – comfortable or otherwise) to another person; it extends to that other human being an invitation of trust that what we share will be honored and that all due respect and dignity will afforded to us. Seems pretty simple, straightforward and practical to me – what about to you? Our day to day work has a holy dimension to it. Did you ever think of it that way – there is a holiness factor to everything we say or do?

To go deeper, ask yourself: Are there any words or names that evoke a sense of awe and wonder in you? What are they? Who do you know who reflects a strong, holy, self-giving presence? What makes that person "holy?" Is it what they say or what they do or perhaps a combination of both? What will you do to better live out the second commandment? But go a step further and switch these question I've posed around: for example, are there words or names that you say or hear other use that are hateful, not loving - prejudiced, not communal divisive, not welcoming? I don't have to list them, because there are too many and plus it would dirty this bulletin if I gave them any kind of prominence here. So what names will you use this week – ones of hate or ones of love? It is our choice, my friends, our Christian duty as a matter of faith to live out the second commandment!

"Then God spoke all these words: 'I am the LORD your God.'" (Exodus 20:1-2)

Dear Parents and Guardians of future altar servers,

It has been some time since we have seen servers assisting at Mass on the altar. We are finally in the position to resume this important ministry for young children, providing them

an opportunity to serve our Lord while deepening the roots of their faith during the holy sacrifice of the Mass. As with everything else in the world, changes and adjustments will be occurring in the altar training program. Father Justin is offering a mandatory training session for ALL servers, both old and new, to orient everyone to new methods while teaching beginners the steps of the way. All children who have made their First Holy Communion are eligible. The training session will be on TUESDAY, AUGUST 24 from 6 - 7 PM in the body of the church. A second session will be offered at a later date if needed. If you and your child/children are interested in this ministry, please arrive ten minutes early so that I may record names and give a brief introduction beforehand. As a side note, in the event that missing class time is a concern, the children will no longer be serving weekday Masses with the exception of holy days, special events, and Friday (whole school) liturgies.




