

## From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

As a spiritual exercise this week, let's take a look at the gospel wherein Jesus shared with his disciples 2,000 years ago and us, his present day disciples: the Beatitudes.



Matthew's gospel narrative reminds us that after Jesus had gathered His disciples, He began to proclaim the Gospel of the Kingdom of God (chapter 4). The Lord then led his friends up the mountain and there He began to teach them. Yes, Jesus is our Lord and Savior, but He is also our Teacher or as our Orthodox sisters and brothers poetically call Him – The Pantocrater. Biblical scholars and theologians have long taught that the Beatitudes show a direct comparison between the Old Testament person of Moses (the law giver) to Jesus in the New Testament – He Who is the fulfillment of the law. No wonder we refer to Jesus not only as the New Adam, but also the New Moses. On the mountain, Jesus will go to the heart of the Law. Remember He doesn't obliterate the Old Law, but adds to it, expands upon it, and gives us, His followers and witnesses, a new

way of relationship with God through the Law.

Let us remember the Law was not meant to be the "be all" or the "end all" in order to be in God's graces or to achieve our return to heaven. Rather, the Law was meant to keep us in a right and loving relationship with God and with our neighbor. Yes, rather than completing a ten-part (A.K.A. The Ten Commandments ala Moses) pass or fail test, Jesus challenges us with the Beatitudes to get to the heart of the Law. Jesus' Beatitudes from this weekend's gospel for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time offer us rewards (blessings) for "good behavior," rather than the "thou-shalt-nots" written on Moses' tablets. However, in no way does Jesus intend to dismiss the commandments. The cancel culture or replacement mentality of our present age absolutely does not apply here! Rather, and very thankfully, the Lord Jesus fulfills the Decalogue (The Ten Commandments) by His words and deeds. Indeed, His words must be our words today. We must imitate Jesus' deeds now. The prayer of Jesus in the Beatitudes is necessary for us every day.

Which of the Beatitudes is your favorite? And why? Take the Gospel home with you this week or look it up online, or better yet, find your Bible and turn the pages. Reread the Beatitudes and re-discover their beauty and spend some time with the one that really strikes you today – the one that you need to peel back the layers, like an onion, that your life right now needs to touch you and reenergize you.

This weekend is the beginning of Catholic School's week. As we reflect on Jesus' teaching on the mountain, consider also this week in praying for our Catholic School students and their teachers. Offer a prayer for our students and faculty in our schools as well as in our parishes' Religious Education programs.

One of my favorite mass hymns might put us all on the right path today, tomorrow, and always. Sing it out loud – live the words!

Open my eyes, Lord. Help me to see your face. Open my eyes, Lord. Help me to see!

Open my ears, Lord. Help me to hear your voice!

Open my ears, Lord. Help me to hear!

Open my heart, Lord. Help me to love like you. Open my heart, Lord Help me to love!
