From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

A very blessed Third Sunday of Easter! Yes, the joy, light, and hope of Easter Sunday continues to stream forth into our lives in these 50 days of the Easter season. As the Gospels throughout these weeks attest – the Lord of All Hopefulness is with us. He walks among us in a new and dynamic way.

OUR CHRISTIAN FAITH IS BASED, AS ALWAYS, ON A PERSONAL MEETING WITH THE RISEN CHRIST!



I leave this previous sentence alone – capitalized and in bold face for a reason. It is such a simple statement – but without it – by attaching to anything else or allowing it to be lost in chaos of our lives, both human and faith – we risk diverting the trajectory that God has traced for us to return to Him in heaven. That is why that statement of faith – of hope – of command by Jesus Himself importantly stands out and is clearly visible before us.

Therefore, a question ask ourselves on this third week of Paschal joy – have we encountered the Risen Christ? What has been our personal, significant, and joy-filled meeting with the One who walked out of the tomb two weeks ago and caused it to become empty, so we might be filled with His life? If you or I cannot specify that meeting with the Rosen Lord by now – the we have much more work (and praying) to do in the Easter days ahead of us. Moreover, guess what? That's not a bad thing. That is the Christian journey: to encounter Christ and allow Him to be encountered, met, and shared within us!

Cosmic and human history – our history – is God-filled! Yet if we continue to "overwrite" the story of our salvation – of God's story of love and

life we see written in the Scriptures, and in particular the Gospels – than we risk obscuring the central message of the scriptures. That is that God is love. That He loves us unconditionally. In addition, He desires with all of His Divine being to have us with Him for all eternity in an existence of unbelievable joy and gladness. We must be careful – avoiding the dangers of our secular and selfish world – not to distort the true meaning of Easter and the message of the Risen Jesus. Yes, we must take Easter – the possibility of new life – seriously.

Our shared Catholic Christian faith does stand of fall on the story of the empty tomb, but on the firm, grounded, and believable conviction that Jesus – the man who died on the Cross, God in His human form – is now and for evermore alive! The great and eminent Biblical scholar of the 20th Century, who forgot more about the Gospel of John than any scholar ever could write down or remember, Raymond Brown, S.S., once put our Easter reality succinctly and simply like this – and I write it separately – capitalized and bold like the other reality above:

"CHRISTIANS BELIEVE IN JESUS, NOT IN A TOMB!"

Yes, my friends, it is life not death. It is hope not sorrow. It is the bright and warm reality of the living and risen Jesus, not the cold, dark, static rock of the tomb that you and I rejoice and glad once again this Easter season.

May these day s of fulfillment of the great Paschal Mysteries continue to enlighten our lives – warm our hearts – and stir our souls to encounter the Risen Jesus and bring (or even drag) others to find Him today, this Easter, and always! Let us continue in the Easter days to sing: ALLELUIA!
