



From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

"Let's keep in touch!" How often have we said that to others? How often have others said that to us? To understand this better, consider the alternative: when we are "out of touch" as many of us were and so many still are since the pandemic. Many of us continue to be distanced, disconnected, dislocated, isolated and alone.

The Gospel message for this Fifth Week of Easter, asks all of us then: Am I in touch with the Lord? How strong, how healthy is my connection to the Lord's vine? Do I have anything or any relationship that needs to be cut back, that need to be pruned, so I can be better connected and closer to God?

There is no green thumb on either of these hands! Artificial flowers that is the way I go! However, those of you who are horticulturally inclined, are you ever afraid that you will cut off too much, or cut off the wrong stuff and kill what you want to grow?



Sometimes the pruning we need to do is simple and a quick cut takes care of business. Nevertheless, sometimes and it is more often than not – the pruning that *needs* to be done – is more major.

It is the same in my life. Sometimes it is a gentle snip here and there - and things will be much better. Cut out the carbs and the waistline shrinks. Amen! And then sometimes in our physical lives and our spiritual lives, we need to escalate the pruning – like when the doctor says there is something toxic

growing inside our frail bodies and it needs to be cut out – literally. It is in those profound moments we say to ourselves: Am I in touch with God? Am I connected? What needs to be pruned in our lives?

Staying connected to God's people at prayer, (just as we are right now) is the best way to stay in touch, to stay connected with the Lord. Here at the holy gathering of the mass, can we stay connected by praying and singing, listening to His word, and most importantly sharing His Body of the Eucharist.

Here in this sacred place every Saturday evening, twice every Sunday morning, every day in churches, chapels, and cathedrals all over the earth, the Lord Jesus Christ makes of our individual bodies and our community together: a womb, a tabernacle, a house where His presence is connected to us – never to be separated.

There's no closer way to be connected to, to be in touch with Jesus, than here in the Eucharist. Let us pray that we will continue to return here to be connected to Him. Let's pray that those who have not been here for a while, for whatever reason, will return and we will welcome them home. Let us pray that we, the branches, will connect, reconnect, and embrace the Him – the vine that gives us life that will never end!
