



# From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

As Thanksgiving is almost upon us this time of the year really accelerates in warp speed! I want to bring to your attention once again some upcoming moments in the parish that can bring us together as a family of faith, but especially bring us together as a community.

WELCOME BACK WEEKEND: I mentioned at the masses last weekend that the first weekend of Advent (next Saturday and Sunday – November 26 & 27) we will be hosting fellowship in the Gathering Space after all the masses, courtesy of the work of our new parish outreach committee. Each gathering will have slightly varied refreshments, but the same thread is community – gathering together in a space designed for that very purpose. I ask you this spend some time after mass next weekend to not only enjoy some good food, but to stay and talk with people. Yes, to get to know your fellow sister and brothers in Christ who are our parish. I can't tell you how many times I am surprised that people in the same parish don't know one another. One factor is that we are creatures of habit. We often attend that same mass time each weekend and sit in the same seat. Often we don't know the other people and families in our own parish. Our world if full of enough divisions and impersonal interactions. Let's change that. As I mentioned last weekend, think week about someone or some people that have not been back to Mass – not returned to our faith community. Invite them to attend mass with you – next to you and then let us gather to just be with one another – to chat about what has been happening in our lives – and reconnect and reorient ourselves as a community of believers, friends and followers of Jesus Christ. Stay after mass – stay for a while – bring a friend or family member – or even a non-Catholic. Let's share our parish our family, or selves with one another.

PARISH COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS TREE: A reminder that the same weekend of our gatherings in the Gathering Space, we will have an early Christmas Tree up in front of the Baptismal Font. Well actually there will be two trees – the other is our Gift of the Magi tree (a new name but the same purpose), which will be starting our annual Christmas gift drive for those who might not be able to find gifts this year. However, back to the big tree! The idea is for all of us to bring an ornament to place on the tree throughout the four weeks of Advent, so that on Christmas night it would be filled with unique and personal representations of all the people in our parish. These can be special ornaments with a story to you and your family. They can be new ones. They can ones you created yourself. Whatever the means or meanings, bring a decoration for the tree so it can be visible sign of our parish family's uniqueness and diversity. Just bring in your ornaments at any time and hang them on the tree between next weekend and Christmas. The tree will remain up until the end of the Christmas season this year on the Feast of the Epiphany in early January. Be sure to place your name on the ornaments just so everyone knows who's is who's when we take them down.

**THANKSGIVING THIS WEEK:** I invite you to attend our Thanksgiving morning mass this on **Thursday at 9 a.m.** We typically have a great turnout for this liturgy, so let's have a good crowd before we set down at our tables at home to feast. Coming together as a family of faith around the table of the Eucharist is a great way to start this special day. See you there!

CHRIST THE KING: Finally just a quick reflection on this last Sunday in Ordinary when we pause to acknowledge Jesus Christ the King of the Universe. In 1969, Saint Paul VI took several steps to enhance the witness of this feast day. To emphasize Christ's universal reign, he changed the name of the celebration to the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of All." (Domini Nostri Iesu Christi universorum Regis) He also changed the date to the last Sunday in the liturgical year, emphasizing even more strongly the connection between Christ's kingship and His second advent (coming) to judge the world. In addition, the pope raised the feast to the highest rank of celebration on the Church calendar, that of a "solemnity." Today, peace still eludes us; social, political and economic orders are shaking; and the nations continue in many ways to reject the light of the Gospel. We can be grateful, then, for the chance to celebrate each year the Solemnity of Christ the King — for the world needs now, more than ever, our witness to His rule over all things.


