## From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

You will notice the cover of the bulletin has been slightly altered as we begin to celebrate our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary over the next twelve months. Each week we will have a historic photo from our parish's rich history. Again, please share any photos or memorabilia with me, so we can make copies of the parish archives and have them for our new history that I am writing.

Last May, I woke up very early on the first Saturday of that month. In part to be prepared for rehearsal for First Holy Communion and to meet our students. Also to get ready for Saturday morning rosary and mass (which I was 5 minutes late). Why was I late? Well, my historical yearnings got the best of me – because I was glued to my television watching the coronation ceremony of Their Majesties King Charles III and Queen Camilla of the United Kingdom. I love pageantry and ceremony and boy I was not disappointed in the least. The moment that truly gave me chills was when Queen Camilla and the King entered the choir area of Westminster Abbey, just steps away from their thrones and high altar of magnificent sacred space. When pages of honor carrying their heavy robes – royal guards around them – the church filled to capacity – as the world watched, trumpets began to soar throughout the light filled sanctuary and the choir perched high above in a balcony near the ceiling, they sang loud, clear, and proud: Vivat Regina Camilla! – Vivat! Vivat! Vivat! followed by Vivat Rex Carolus – Vivat! Vivat! Vivat! Vivat! In a much-anglicized pronunciation of the Latin text, they were chanting – announcing – proclaiming – cheering: Long live, Queen Camilla! Long live, King Charles! I remember thinking, "Wow! This is for real now!" I can only imagine what the King and Queen were feeling.

This weekend, after hopefully a joyous celebration of Thanksgiving with our loved ones and friends, we continue to give thanks and rejoice on this great and solemn feast of Christ the King of the Universe! Our King – the Lord – wears a crown not of gold, but of thorns. He bears not a royal specter in His hands, but still the nail marks. He was adorned with a crimson and fur lined royal cloak carried by pages of honor, but was covered in blood from the weight of the Cross that He carried. There were no choirs for Him singing that He may live long – but angry crowds that shouted to crucify Him! Yet He is greater – more majestic – and eternal that any king or queen of this earth. At the coronation, for the first time in public, we saw King Charles kneel in humble reflection before the altar and aloud prayed to Jesus Christ, shortly after he spoke the first words of his coronation ceremony, quoting the Lord in the Gospel: "I come to serve, not be served."

Every time we enter into the sacred mysteries of our redemption by participating and sharing in the Eucharist at Mass, we encounter our King – we hear the trumpets blast – we witness a royal procession as the Lord of All Life and Hope in



the Bread that becomes His Body surrounds us, and then we walk to Him and bow too in humble prayer, as He becomes one with us. I wish at every Mass — at every altar — when the priest raises that host that by the power of the Holy Spirit is transformed into the Body of Christ, that trumpets could sound like in May in London and a choir would intone — declare — announce the reality of what we are encountering VIVAT REX CHRISTUS! LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING!

Our King must live in us and through us. Our King is the way to and the truth of eternal life – where we our salvation will not merely be long, but forever. Think of that trumpet-heralding phrase next week when you approach our King in the communion line on the first weekend of Advent and every time we are privileged to bow before and unite our bodies with the King of the universe: Vivat Rex Christus! Vivat! Vivat! Vivat!

Let us give thanks for these past 150 years a nd move forward together as one family of faith in Christ!
