From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

The date was November 11, 1918 - one hundred years ago this week, when a soldier in his early twenties ascended a hill near a lingering battle in southern Italy. Little did he know that that morning the armistice had been signed and the Great War - The War to End All Wars - what we now call World War I was already over. But the surrender had not yet reached them. As he climbed a little farther up the hill a bullet whizzed by his head, knocking off his metal helmet, narrowly missing his skull. It's a good thing too, because that young Italian soldier was my great-grandfather Vincenzo. He lived to come to America and raise a family which included my grandmother. My grandfather's father, Antonio, fought for the United States in that war a century ago and he lived too. So many young soldiers and civilians did not. Those who came back from Europe in those early years of the 20th century, history dubbed "The Lost Generation." It took so long for them to heal. War has not changed in 100 years - only worse in its destruction. Those left behind including our brave men and women in uniform also endure pain and suffering to this day.

This Veteran's Day - on the Centennial of the end of First World War, we all must bow our heads in thanks for our freedom and for those individuals, many of relatives and friends - who fought for and some even paying the ultimate price of giving their lives, our freedom. Even if the weather is wet or cold, as you walk or drive by a cemetery this week and see those flags waving - go over and say a prayer, especially for the veterans of World War I. None of them are left to tell their stories. Many of their families are gone and cannot pray for them here on earth. So let us do so.

Historian Maggie Brennan of Purdue University reminds us: "World War I was a horrifying period in human history. Some, though, looked past the brutality of the weaponry, the squalid conditions of the trenches, and the excessive amount of casualties on both sides and instead, saw God. In the early years of the twentieth century, Catholicism had, for decades, been losing congregants throughout Europe and North America, and it looked as if that process was set to continue. World War I, however, led to a resurgence in the number of the faithful, and increased the public expression of faith, particularly in France. These both came about largely as a result of the efforts of the papacy and the interactions between French and German citizens, soldiers, and clergy in Northern France during the war. The Pope [Benedict XV] served as the model of the Church's message of universality and loving one's neighbor, and despite the fact that during the war the French and Germans were enemies, for Catholics, on both sides, faith overcame national differences and at times cooperation arose between the two, which helped to revitalize Catholicism."

We live in a time that needs a revitalization of Catholicism too - not by war, but by loving one another more deeply, engaging in forgiveness and mercy more often, by following God's voice and not our own. If you know a veteran, especially in your family. If you see someone in uniform. Pray for them. Thank them. Respect them. All of us - living and deceased - deserve the same, not just in November 11th but every day.

Here's a prayer for this Veteran's Day: Father of all, remember your holy promise, and look with love on all your people, living and departed. On this day we especially ask that you would hold for ever all who suffered during the First World War, those who returned scarred by warfare, those who waited anxiously at home, and those who returned wounded, and disillusioned; those who mourned, and those communities that were diminished and suffered loss. Remember too those who acted with kindly compassion, those who bravely risked their own lives for their comrades, and those who in the aftermath of war, worked tirelessly for a more peaceful world. And as you remember them, remember us, O Lord; grant us peace in our time and a longing for the day when people of every language, race, and nation will be brought into the unity of Christ's kingdom. This we ask in the name of the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



Scrip is "no-selling" fundraising. On June 1, 2010, changes were required in the Scrip Program to keep in compliance with current IRS regulations. Scrip purchasers will have multiple options of how to use Scrip rebates. You can use your rebate money as tuition credit, or as a donation to the school.
