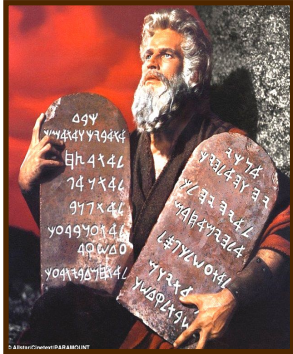

From the Pastor's Desk

FORBIDDEN SUBJECT! REALLY?: *The Sixth Commandment Unveiled* Ten Commandments Reflection Series Part VI of X

My dear parish family:



On our journey towards a deeper understanding and spiritual reflection on the Ten Commandments, we arrive this at the sixth commandment! What is forbidden by this commandment? Just as with the other commandments, there is an obvious level: the sixth commandment forbids all sexual conduct except within a validly sanctioned, marriage. Therefore, it forbids adultery, prostitution, rape and other such terrible wounds that are sadly inflicted on the human person. We know this by reading newspapers and watching the news. However, its tentacles, like that of a rabid octopus, reach far wider. It also includes such habits as masturbation and pornography, just to name a few. Finally, the commandment calls us as faithful Christians not to *trivialize* sexuality, that is, any attempt to wipe away the holiness and sacredness sex so as to make it simply a source of pleasure and recreation, in other words, “a casual thing.” One of the triggers that humanity is caught up in when trying to fight the temptation of breaking this commandment, among other things, is lust, the attitude that sees another as a mere object, and not to be given the full respect that is necessary and is a God-given gift to all human persons – yes, ALL human persons.

Nevertheless, the sixth commandment is more than series of “thou shall not’s,” just like the other nine! Properly respected, this commandment helps nurture an understanding within which sexuality can be what the Creator intended it to be, a powerful, life-giving, family building, soul stabilizing experience that gives us the delight for which we were made. However, this needs explanation, the theologian Father Ron Rohlheiser, O.M.I. explains in this way, and I quote him:

“Sexuality is more than just having sex. It is a dimension of our self-awareness, an all-embracing yearning inside of us within which we feel that we have been cut off and within which we hunger for union again with the whole. In sexuality we are haunted by the fact that we are one small fragment of something larger, that we are away from home, and that, above all else, we would like to go home. Hence, sexuality is nostalgia, a drive, a fire, a pressure for connection: connection in love to community, family, friendship, creativity, play, marital union with another person, and immortality. To have these in our lives is to sleep with someone; to not have them is to sleep alone, irrespective of how much or little sex we might be having. The sixth commandment tries to protect and nurture this understanding.”

Among all the things that the Creator gave us, the gift of sex, is perhaps the most powerful, beautiful, and life-giving. It is, however, when abused, also perhaps potentially the most destructive. Few things heal or hurt the soul as deeply as does sex. It is a gift when properly respected, a perversion when not. In either case, it is a powerful fire. As God spoke to Moses upon Mount Sinai, to not commit adultery is, ultimately, a matter of respect. To keep the sixth commandment is to properly respect the sacredness, beauty, and the power of that great fire. Recall when God spoke again to his servant Moses from the Burning Bush – from a fire that did not destroy, but illuminate the heart! By not committing adultery is to have our shoes off before the burning bush because we know we are on holy ground.

It is true the human body – our human sexuality can be confusing, complicated and at times frustrating and frightening. However, that is natural and if we look at our sexuality as a gift and not some forbidden subject with a strange Puritan mindset, I believe we’ll be amazed at how better we can express love: love for God, love for others, love for ourselves! I asked a priest once, “When do sexual frustrations and temptations stop?” His answer: “Ten minutes after your dead!!” Therefore, we have some work, some praying, some loving to do!

Then God spoke all these words: ‘I am the LORD your God.’” (Exodus 20:1-2)
May we listen and love Him in new ways as our journey of faith continues!

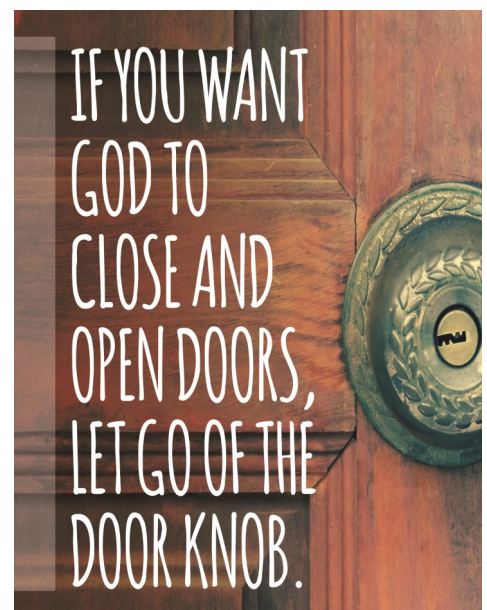
