*From the Pastor's Desk*

My dear parish family:

The month of November is dedicated to all the faithful departed - those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. Many of these souls are known to us, though many more are known but to God's memory.

You will notice the table in the sanctuary with the book and white candle. This is our parish Book of remembrance. You may write in this book the names of anyone whom you wish the parish to remember this month. Also you received an All Soul's envelope in your packet. There are spaces on the back of this envelope to write names of the deceased also. These envelopes will be placed on the altar itself for the entire month. Even if you did not attend our All Soul's mass on November 2nd, please consider dropping the envelope in the collection basket to remember the dead.

This past week on October 29th marked what would have been my maternal grandfather, Leonard's, 97th birthday. I never had the opportunity to know him, for he died just before my 2nd birthday in 1983. But I know so much about him because my grandmother, my mother and my aunt always told stories about him. He was kept alive in my memory by their memories. To celebrate his 97th birthday this week I prepared for my dinner that evening - fried bologna sandwiches and Cream of Asparagus soup (very hot soup which he liked), which were two of his favorite foods. I knew this because I was told about him.

Though for most of my life he was physically absent, my grandfather was part of me. I have traits that he had, because I was told thus. He has always had a special place in my heart. Photographs of him and other relatives that have been long dead that I never knew adorn many albums and frames in my room.

Let's take an opportunity this month to recall our beloved family and friends who no longer are with again in a physical sense, but part of the fabric of our identities and lives nonetheless. Thumb through the photographs. Take a walk to the family plot at a cemetery. Sit down with other family members and reminisce or better yet ask about people you never met and see how much they and you have in common. This is especially important for a way to hand on traditions, memories and the love of our families to younger generations.

November is not a sad time, a dark sorrowful time to recall the dead - but a time of prayer, a time of memory, a time for joy. We are an Easter people - a Christian people of hope. Let us pray this month and all months that the faithful departed - those who we recall their names and those who need us to pray for them who are nameless, that they will make their eternity in heaven. May all the souls of the faithful departed their the mercy of God rest in peace, Amen.

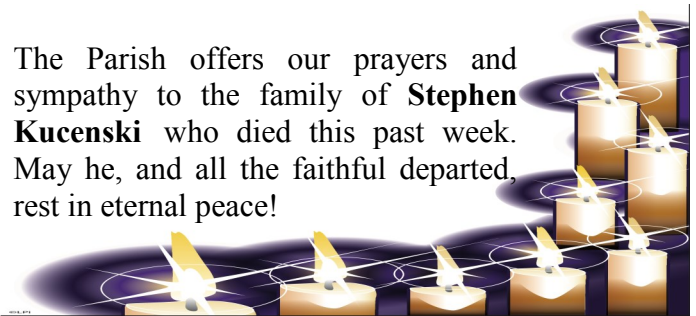

**Scrip is fundraising while you shop®.** This program allows you to purchase gift cards and certificates for everyday expenses like food, clothing, and entertainment while earning a percentage of each dollar of Scrip purchased back in revenue. Scrip is "no-selling" fundraising. On June 1, 2010, changes were required in the Scrip Program to keep in compliance with current IRS regulations. Scrip purchasers will have multiple options of how to use Scrip rebates. You can use your rebate money as tuition credit, or as a donation to the school. For example, you could designate 80% as tuition credit and 20% as a donation to the school. For more information
