

# From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

"I urge that you be united." (1 Corinthians 1:10) The Church was a mess. It was out of control. Some of the members were visiting prostitutes. One was even having an affair with his stepmother! They were taking each other to court. Some were abusing the celebration of the Eucharist. Others did not believe in the Resurrection. No matter where you looked, there were signs of division, discord and disunity! Welcome to the Church at Corinth. Those crazy Corinthians and that is what Paul walked into. No wonder he admonished his friends there in these words: "I urge you to be united!" Easy to say Paul, but it takes lots of patience and understanding to actually accomplish!



Saint Paul knew this when he arrived to minister to the Corinthians, but he didn't quit. He didn't take his "ball and bat and go home." He relied on one person and one person alone. The one who unites all people, who dies for all people, who promises eternal life for all people – Jesus Christ. Before he tackled the specific issues the Corinthians needed to solve, Paul first thanked God for all the blessings He had given to them in the first place. "God is faithful," Paul prayed "He will keep you firm to the end." When we encounter division or obstacles to unity, do we immediately throw up our arms and complain about all the problems we have or all the

things that divide us OR do we thank God for all we have received to this point and move forward together? Ever hear the phrase: Embrace what unites us rather than what divides us?" It's nice to say. Moreover, it's nice to hear also. However, do we mean it? Can we live it? Will we share it? The faith, the hope, and the trust that Paul taught so many centuries ago, must enter into our hearts and then in return be shared and live.

Does scripture say that Paul panicked today because of these divisions? Does our second reading this weekend recount that Paul gave up, packed his things and got back on the boat because the Corinthians were afraid and maybe even angry because of this change, transition, this move toward a better unity? Did Paul tell the people "go figure it out yourselves?" No – I say it again no!

When life seems out of control. When we seem confused by new ways and new changes, we have to remember that God never will abandon us and we must never abandon one another! We must remember and live out that unity means letting go of things that we might hold dear so that we can forward together We must practice forgiveness because removing misunderstandings and divisions is necessary for accepting God's will in our parish – our diocese – our homes and our hearts. We must wake up every morning and know that love must be the first option, the last option, the only option, so that we may continue to be "one, holy, Catholic and apostolic Church!"

Every time we gather in these pews, we have a chance to deepen our relationship with God's Son, with His Church and with one another – to be one people in Christ! We can no longer allow ourselves the complacency of the past, "The way things have always been" needs to become the "the way things need to be" if we have any hope of preaching Jesus Christ to the world around us – so that the next generation of Catholics here will fill these same pews. This is the only reason the Church exists. No one "owns" the Church; not the bishops; not the clergy, and not the laity. The Church belongs to Jesus Christ and to Him alone. Nevertheless, all of us in different ways, no matter what our vocation, have responsibility for the Church and her mission. The mark of true Christian discipleship is to share every day, the love of Jesus Christ with each other. That's what unites us!

Social media has made it far too easy for me to share my opinion.

These virtual spaces tend to strip our words of all empathy. Someone will post something that I think is nonsense, and I just have to tell them why — and quickly! Hurry! Before they delete it!

Nine times out of ten, when the dust is settled, I find that I've said too much and listened too little.

As I've gotten older, the motto I try (not always successfully) to live by is this: You do not have to be on the attack all of the time, even if it's for what you think is the truth.

I can't help but notice that the first thing Jesus does when he hears of the arrest of John the Baptist is to retreat. He doesn't punch a hole in a wall or take to the streets in protest. He withdraws.

And what does he do after withdrawing? A lot of praying, I would imagine. A lot of thinking, a lot of reflecting. A lot of listening to the voice of his Father.

Sometimes we mistake stillness with vulnerability. But Christ shows us that to withdraw, to contemplate, can actually be a tremendous show of strength. Even the fiercest dogs wait for the command of their master before they act.

### Religious and Pro Life Lending Library -




# Children's Liturgy
