

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

THE SABBATH IS THE SEVENTH DAY OF THE WEEK. AFTER SIX DAYS IN WHICH HUMANITY IN SOME SENSE PARTICIPATES IN GOD'S WORK OF CREATION, THE SABBATH IS THE DAY OF REST. BUT SOMETHING QUITE UNPRECEDENTED HAPPENED IN THE NASCENT CHURCH: THE PLACE OF THE SABBATH, THE SEVENTH DAY, WAS TAKEN BY THE FIRST DAY. AS THE DAY OF THE LITURGICAL ASSEMBLY, IT IS THE DAY FOR ENCOUNTER WITH GOD THROUGH JESUS CHRIST WHO AS THE RISEN LORD ENCOUNTERED HIS FOLLOWERS ON THE FIRST DAY, SUNDAY, AFTER THEY HAD FOUND THE TOMB EMPTY. THE STRUCTURE OF THE WEEK IS OVERTURNED. NO LONGER DOES IT POINT TOWARDS THE SEVENTH DAY, AS THE TIME TO PARTICIPATE IN GOD'S REST. IT SETS OUT FROM THE FIRST DAY AS THE DAY OF ENCOUNTER WITH THE RISEN LORD. THIS ENCOUNTER HAPPENS AFRESH AT EVERY CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST, WHEN THE LORD ENTERS ANEW INTO THE MIDST OF HIS DISCIPLES AND GIVES HIMSELF TO THEM, ALLOWS HIMSELF, SO TO SPEAK, TO BE TOUCHED BY THEM, SITS DOWN AT TABLE WITH THEM. THIS CHANGE IS UTTERLY EXTRAORDINARY, CONSIDERING THAT THE SABBATH, THE SEVENTH DAY SEEN AS THE DAY OF ENCOUNTER WITH GOD, IS SO PROFOUNDLY ROOTED IN THE OLD TESTAMENT. IF WE ALSO BEAR IN MIND HOW MUCH THE MOVEMENT FROM WORK TOWARDS THE REST-DAY CORRESPONDS TO A NATURAL RHYTHM, THE DRAMATIC NATURE OF THIS CHANGE IS EVEN MORE STRIKING. THIS REVOLUTIONARY DEVELOPMENT THAT OCCURRED AT THE VERY THE BEGINNING OF THE CHURCH'S HISTORY CAN BE EXPLAINED ONLY BY THE FACT THAT SOMETHING UTTERLY NEW HAPPENED THAT DAY. THE FIRST DAY OF THE WEEK WAS THE THIRD DAY AFTER JESUS' DEATH. IT WAS THE DAY WHEN HE SHOWED HIMSELF TO HIS DISCIPLES AS THE RISEN LORD. IN TRUTH, THIS ENCOUNTER HAD SOMETHING UNSETTLING ABOUT IT. THE WORLD HAD CHANGED. THIS MAN WHO HAD DIED WAS NOW LIVING WITH A LIFE THAT WAS NO LONGER THREATENED BY ANY DEATH. A NEW FORM OF LIFE HAD BEEN INAUGURATED, A NEW DIMENSION OF CREATION. THE FIRST DAY, ACCORDING TO THE GENESIS ACCOUNT, IS THE DAY ON WHICH CREATION BEGINS. NOW IT WAS THE DAY OF CREATION IN A NEW WAY, IT HAD BECOME THE DAY OF THE NEW CREATION. WE CELEBRATE THE FIRST DAY. AND IN SO DOING WE CELEBRATE GOD THE CREATOR AND HIS CREATION. YES, WE BELIEVE IN GOD, THE CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH. AND WE CELEBRATE THE GOD WHO WAS MADE MAN, WHO SUFFERED, DIED, WAS BURIED AND ROSE AGAIN. WE CELEBRATE THE DEFINITIVE VICTORY OF THE CREATOR AND OF HIS CREATION. WE CELEBRATE THIS DAY AS THE ORIGIN AND THE GOAL OF OUR EXISTENCE. WE CELEBRATE IT BECAUSE NOW, THANKS TO THE RISEN LORD IT IS DEFINITIVELY ESTABLISHED THAT REASON IS STRONGER THAN UNREASON, TRUTH STRONGER THAN LIES, LOVE STRONGER THAN DEATH. WE CELEBRATE THE FIRST DAY BECAUSE WE KNOW THAT THE BLACK LINE DRAWN ACROSS CREATION DOES NOT LAST FOREVER. WE CELEBRATE IT BECAUSE WE KNOW THAT THOSE WORDS FROM THE END OF THE CREATION ACCOUNT HAVE NOW BEEN DEFINITIVELY FULFILLED: "GOD SAW EVERYTHING THAT HE HAD MADE, AND BEHOLD, IT WAS VERY GOOD" (GEN 1:31). AMEN. [Pope Benedict XVI's Easter Homily + April 23, 2011]

I have always said that I love the way the late Pope Benedict wrote and spoke. This sizable excerpt from his penultimate, next to the last, that is, Easter homily of the Holy Father shows us two aspects for our mediation, prayer, and reflection on this next to the last Sunday of the official Easter season. First, the utmost importance of the Lord's Day – the Sabbath – Sunday! Do we rest from our labors on Sunday? Do we rest enough as to contemplate the awesome wonder and love that God has given us, especially through the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of His Only Son – the Risen Jesus, to whom we see, receive, and share every time we accept Him in the form of the Holy Eucharist? Yes, first, do we keep, respect, and promote a holy Sabbath-Sunday? The second point and I believe Pope Benedict makes it quite clear in the above paragraph of his homily, do we recognize and even more so, do we value the fact that far as Pentecost and the end of the official 50 days of Easter, that every Sunday is Easter?

Re-read this section of the Benedict's Easter thought. Maybe even three or four more times! See how he repeats over and over – almost in every sentence it seems – the gift of newness concerning Sunday – our celebration together of the Eucharist at Mass – the wonder and magnificence of Easter. Yes, every Saturday evening – every Sunday morning, when we come as a community of believers to encounter Jesus at the tables of Word and Sacrament, let us see with eyes of faith, let us hear, let us touch, let us love the newness of the Sabbath – the newness of Easter all year long – the newness of finding once again the Risen Jesus. Amen - so bet it!!




