From the Pastor's Desk

EASTER REFLECTION SERIES ON THE GLORIOUS MYSTERIES (III) The Third Mystery of Glory: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

My dear parish family:

This week our third reflection on the Glorious mysteries continues to focus on the Blessed Virgin Mary during this month dedicated to her.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary reminds us that we believe that at the end of her earthly life, the BVM was taken body and soul into the fullness of heaven. We don't have any details of her passing from this life in the Scriptures, but we do have our tradition. Perhaps she was surrounded by the Beloved Disciple and others. We just do not have those details. I love this description by Bishop Robert Barron, one of the Church's foremost evangelists and the Auxiliary Bishop of Los Angeles, California: the Assumption is that it is not a journey through space as sometimes depicted in art with Mary being lifted up on a cloud with angels transporting her from earth to the heavenly realm. "Mary," says Bishop Barron, "was translated into the totality of her being from this dimensional system (earth) to the higher one for which we use the word, 'heaven.' It is not so much somewhere but somehow else." Also in the teaching of our Church, heaven and earth are not totally separated. They are somehow woven together. Mary helps us by her intercession, prayer, and motherly love to connect the threads, if you would – to help us in our flawed humanity, weave ourselves together with the divine. Therefore, the Assumption was certainly not the end of her mission, but a new translation to "somehow else" to which her mission continues with us and for us to this day.

Although she was never stained by original sin, Mary, like all of us, always had free will to choose. She said yes to become the Mother of God. She experienced the joy in Jesus's life, and she painfully and lovingly endured His Passion because He said it must be so...and yet, she never lost faith in God's will. Her life was the model of discipleship to Jesus. While He hung on the Cross, Jesus asked her to once again be a mother—this time to His Church – to you and to me. Again, she said yes. She chose to follow and most of all trust in God's will. Each day we can choose to follow our mother, Mary, because she only leads us to one person, not herself, never, but to her Son Jesus Christ. If we follow Mary's example and her love for her Son, we too can share in His Resurrection.

May we reflect then: Do we try to follow Mary's example by saying yes when we are called upon to do God's will? Is our faith and hope strengthened by Mary's Assumption, body and soul, into heaven? Let us pray that we are given strength and grace each day so that we are prepared to say yes when we are called to do the will of God – not so much where that will be, but HOW we can make it happen!



God of power and life, who chose the sinless Virgin Mary to be Mother of your Son and raised her, body and soul, to the glory of heaven, set our hearts upon the things that are above and lift us up to share in her glory. Faithful to your promise, O God, you have lifted up the lowly, clothing with heavenly splendor the woman who bore Christ, our life and resurrection. Grant that the Church, prefigured in Mary, may bear Christ to the world and come to share his triumph. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. AMEN.

We hope to enjoy the fullness of His glory! Lather Justin
