

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:



Courtesy is small and simple, like the mustard seed in our Gospel today. The typical mustard seed is about a quarter of an inch round, but it can grow to become a huge tree, about 15 feet tall in a matter of weeks! Jesus uses this image to describe what the kingdom of God is like. The kingdom of God is where people experience something heavenly, something divine. All it takes are simple good deeds like courtesy to help someone around us begin to experience the kingdom of God with us. We've all heard of these moments - "random acts of kindness" right? But why must they be random? Why can't you and I share these small – simple mustard

seed moments – courtesy – all the time? What about "daily acts of kindness?" Sure, that's possible! And we don't have to make it complicated either, keep it simple – keep it small – and we'll be amazed how our relationships, our hearts, our faith will grow.

Every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation, for some every day we share at this table or at an altar elsewhere a small, round, host... a cup of simple wine... that for all their simplicity become none other than Jesus Christ Himself, our Lord, and God. Simple gifts – small by comparison to some gifts people buy one another and go into debt because its so expensive, simple gifts that are transformed into food for the world. Talk about growth. Two thousand years ago in an upper room, a charismatic rabbi sat around a table with his twelve closest friends. There were no fancy gold table clothes, engraved silverware, Waterford crystal glasses. It wasn't a six course meal that made them bloated and uncomfortable after eating too much. There were no long winded speeches or toasts like at banquets we might attend nowadays. Bread and wine.....blessed and broken.....and shared. "Do this in memory of me." There are those simple words again. Jesus asks the apostles to take Him – to share Him with the world. And they did.

That night of the Last Supper the Lord planted twelve mustard seeds of faith into the hearts of simple, imperfect human people. Sadly one of those seeds was discarded quickly for thirty pieces of silver. But for the others, after Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection the seeds grew and they scattered the seeds into the world. Faith in Jesus Christ grew! It grew because it was shared. If the apostles hadn't shred the faith – watered the seeds with their witness – Christianity would have been snuffed out long ago. If the first believers hadn't multiplied all those simple little moments, then Jesus' name would have disappeared and His message would have never made it past Jerusalem and been forgotten by now. We know different. Why? Because a little faith goes a long way.

Some people think little is not enough, we always need more! Many focus just on quantity: fifty dollars is far better than five - two pieces of birthday cake is far greater than just one even though one is plenty for our waistlines and blood sugar count – numbers even creep into our Church life, when it's October Count time when we enumerate the folks in the pews for the diocese – 100 people at mass is bad, 300 much better. How fast we forget about growth – that size doesn't matter – that the little, the simple, the ordinary can change everything.

A long time ago in a city far away from this city, one man – one – carried a cross, was nailed to it, hung there for three hours, suffered excruciating pain and died. One death, eh, that won't make much of a difference. One seed planted in the ground, that's not going to amount to much. That one man did make the difference! That one seed He planted on Calvary that was watered with His blood did amount to much! And we are here today because of that act of kindness. Not random at all is it?

May God bless you in His abundance this week! Faller


