From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

As I have been mentioning in the past weeks, our parish will host the traditional three-days of devotion known as Forty Hours on November 8 - 9 - 10. There will be moments of prayer each morning (mass on Wednesday and Thursday), and each evening we will gather for devotions at 7 p.m. in the church. Adoration will begin each day at 9 am and continue until devotions each evening. There will be an opportunity for confessions before services from 4-5 p.m. in the two sacristies.

Friday the 10^{th} we will close Forty Hours with Mass in honor of our patron saint – Saint Leo. This Mass will also serve as the opening liturgy of our yearlong celebration of our parish sesquicentennial – the 150^{th} anniversary! Events will be planned throughout the coming year to honor our heritage and prepare for the future. Please join us each evening.

I am grateful for our two guest priest homilists, who will join us this week: I will be offering the reflection the first evening; former deacon and assistant here at Saint Leo, **Father William Laska** from Brookville will be with us on Thursday; and our native son priest, **Father Mark Groeger** will join us for the feast day and anniversary mass on Friday.

Again, please join us each day as we continue to reorient ourselves and revive in our hearts, the love for the Holy Eucharist. With that in mind, here are some thoughts on this central mystery of our Catholic faith in order to prepare us for this week:

When we receive the Eucharist, we respond after the minister says, "*The Body of Christ?*" – "*Amen*" – Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke, for "*it is true*" – in other words, Yes! I believe. We are saying: yes, I know that this is the body of our Savior Jesus Christ. We are saying yes, I know that through Jesus Christ we will all find eternal life if we live a life in accord his teachings and the teachings of the Church. We are saying yes, it is true that this bread – this wine – has been transformed and Jesus is now part of our own bodies. And it should blow us away!

We might not be able to physically see Christ in bodily form as we see one another, but we certainly see and feel his effects on us and that of the whole world. Many of us can pinpoint those times in our lives that were darkened with great difficulty and pain – perhaps it's right now. Nevertheless, somehow there came relief – there came happiness, once again. <u>The happiness that all of us seek – the happiness that all people have the right to</u> <u>enjoy -- has a name – has a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth hidden in the Eucharist. It is the mystery of the</u> <u>Passion hidden in the bread.</u>

God made himself visible in Jesus his Son. Through Jesus we are able to see the Father. In the love story recounted in the Bible, he comes toward us; he seeks to win our hearts, all the way from the Last Supper, to the piercing of his heart on the Cross, to the joy of his Resurrection. In the word, the sacraments and especially in the Eucharist we too experience God's love. He loves us, he makes us see and we experience his love. And love must be our response – our gift in return.

On April 14, 2005, the day of his inauguration as the Successor of Saint Peter, Pope Benedict XVI remarked the following: *"The Church is alive – she is alive because Christ is alive, because he is truly risen. If we let Christ into our lives, we lose nothing, nothing, absolutely nothing of what makes life free, beautiful and great. Only in this friendship are the doors of life opened wide. He takes nothing away, and he gives you everything. When we give ourselves to him, we receive a hundredfold in return." CHRIST OFFERS US THE GIFT OF THE EUCHARIST EVERY DAY AND THE REWARD IS SO GREAT! WHAT WILL WE GIVE BACK TO HIM? WHAT WILL WE DO "IN MEMORY OF HIM?" Come to all three nights of Forty Hours and see!*
