

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:



Baptism is very much about love! Yes, it's also about our entrance into the family of God – the Church. Yes, it's about washing us free from Original Sin. Yes, it does begin our journey of discipleship to Jesus Christ – opening the doorway to the sacred – inviting us to be recipients of God's inexhaustible grace. Yet Baptism is about how intensely God loves us that He does all these things through His inexhaustible grace (the washing, inviting and journeying) so that we might know Him and love Him in this world and eventually, when He calls us home, be with Him forever in Heaven. The road back home to heaven begins at Baptism! However, in between our baptism and returning home, there is life – as messy and difficult as it can be for us, especially in the past two years. Yes, life intervenes and we must ask ourselves how do we love God in return from the moment of our baptism (and additional experiences of Him in the other sacraments) before we, hopefully, return to heaven?

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, comes at the beginning of a new year -2022, is an excellent opportunity for each of us to review our relationship with God and His

Beloved Son, Jesu Christ, the One who has come again to begin again the cycle of salvation from Bethlehem to Calvary and many places - touching many hearts along the way. In God's eyes: we are good; we are pleasing to Him. That is why He created us in the first place – not for fun or our of some "puppet master amusement." No – we are created – beloved by Him, because it is love that fuels every particle of existence of God. Along with Christ, we are God's beloved as His divine voices booms from the clouds in the gospel account of Jesu's baptism this weekend. No, we are not perfect – not even close - but God loves us even though we have flaws – faults – sins.

For God – love comes first. Love comes first! And when humanity, through sin and weakness and doubts, fails to love, when we reject God's love or that of others, when we abuse or ignore love what comes from God then what? The answer is mercy. First, there is love - then there is mercy. Before we existed, God loved us. When we enter into the world God loves us. Before God looks at our faults and failures – He loves us. Before God judges us – He loves me. Moreover, after God judges us – He loves us. This cycle of love is exponentially re-energized at our baptism.

Why would someone not desire with all their heart to have their child baptized? Some people do sadly, so pray for them that they hear God's loving voice this year to come to the saving waters and celebrate the greatest sacrament of love, mercy, and welcome we can imagine. Yes, pray that they walk through the doorway to the sacred and are flooded by God's grace!

All the pain and brokenness, all the sin in the world, all the sin in our lives, comes, in one way or another, from our not believing, not accepting, from our doubting that we are loved by God. So many people doubt that they are lovable at all. Yes, they doubt that they are loved by others or worse yet, doubt that God loves them. That impossible, by the way. God does not know how to not love. When we doubt that we are loved it's then that we begin to trip, stumble, fall and, often, end up looking for love in all the wrong places. If we have fallen into that darkness, the light of Christ this year can led us out. No doubt!

Every one of us needs the assurance of the Father's blessing, which God the Father withholds from no one. God offers each of us that blessing to help us live and love as fully and deeply as God intends and desires us to live and love. In addition, we are called to love and bless one another in the same way. Before we get to know others, we are called to love them – even before we know them. After we've come to know their assets and liabilities, we are called to love them. Before we label others, we are called to love them. Before we judge others, we are called to love them. That is how God works. May His ways - His love be our ways - our love. Love always comes first because the God who loves us - is love!

This new year, let us hear God's voice – as did Jesus and John the Baptist that day in the Jordan River. God whispers it every day – He even shouts it when we especially need to hear it – yet do we listen? Do we hear Him say, "You are my beloved. I love you?" Do we hear Him? Do we repeat what He says to others or back to Him?



Child Protection ~

Online Gaming: 72% of teens, both male and female (ages 13-17) play video games. More than half of those teens said they have made new friends online. The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children analysis of Cyber Tipline reports has found that gaming platforms are more often used in the online enticement of young boys than any other group of children. It is important for parents to talk to their child about safety in online gaming. Some important questions to ask are: Have you ever been cyberbullied while gaming? Do you know what information is OK to share about yourself while gaming? Has anyone talked about sex while you were gaming or asked you to send pictures of yourself? 
