

# From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

# REDISCOVEING THE SACRAMENTS (Part 6 of 7) Anointing of the Sick: Heal Them in Body, in Soul and in Spirit



After my ordination I spent the summer at St. George Church in Erie. Inevitably whenever the pastor is away that's when trouble starts – the roof leaks or the sacristy catches on fire. Well one day the pastor was away – so was the assistant. And so it happened – the phone rang and one of our parishioners was near death at his home. I grabbed my oil and spun the wheels of my car. The drive wasn't far, but I was so afraid of not getting there in time. I arrived and immediately apologized while I fumbled with my book. Although I thought I had memorized the prayers the adrenalin was pumping through my system because this was my first anointing. But

God's grace came, as it always does, and I anointed Tim Brugger. I hugged his wife and daughters and left them to say goodbye to Tim. The goodbye came 5 minutes later.

The day after Tim's funeral I got another call. Tim's pregnant daughter Michelle was in the hospital. The stress had sent her into premature labor. Once again the Oil of Infirm was in my pocket and I raced to St. Vincent Hospital. This time I couldn't anoint. Baby Addison was premature and in an incubator, unable to be touched. I prayed over God's newest creation, this tiny child, asking God to heal her in body, soul and spirit. And then I realized standing in that Natal ICU, looking at that little baby with all those tubes going into her, that it was the first time I was in the same situation since I (a premature baby too) was born. Now that little baby (she's almost 14 years old) is full of good health and life. How amazing God works! God *does* heal our wounds whether we are just a few hours old or 90 years old. He gives us courage, strength and hope from our first breathe to our last and every one in between!

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be our most misunderstood "outward sign of God's inward grace." Many times people still refer to it as Last Rites, presupposing that anointing should only be thought of with impending death. Not so. When someone is seriously ill a priest should be called for and the sacrament be celebrated. The hope is that through the anointing with oil the sick person will be healed and recover. Sometimes they do and sometimes they must be ready to meet the Lord. When death is fast approaching another facet of the Anointing of the Sick is celebrated. Viaticum – Latin for "food for the journey" – is when the dying person receives the Eucharist for the last time, to prepare them and strengthen them to see God face to face. This fulfills the words of John in his Gospel (6:54): "Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day." But as the Lord reminds us "we do not know the time nor the hour," so judgments of the situation must always be made. Nonetheless if someone you know is sick or dying, many times we don't know this is happening, so please call the rectory at any time.

Anointing of the Sick, like Penance and Eucharist, may be repeated as many times as necessary. For instance in preparation for surgery, elderly persons who may be weakened but not necessarily sick, children who are ill and even persons who have lost consciousness or the ability to communicate – we must always trust that God's grace is always operative even when our frail human bodies are not.

Like all the Sacred Sacraments, Anointing of the Sick, is best celebrated in communion with others namely, family and friends surrounding the sick person. Part of the rite is to lay hands on the sick individual showing our support and cooperation with God in the healing process. Sometimes the priest is the only one there, but even in that moment the sick or dying person is certainly not alone – the angels and communion of saints, the countless holy ones, are there in that hospital room, nursing home or bedroom, to witness the healing hand of God, the Divine Physician, touching our weak human bodies to either pick us up or welcome us into eternity.

Whatever the outcome the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, like the other six, is a moment of joy – of celebration – of knowing that we are not alone. GOD IS ALWAYS WITH US! We must never feel abandoned by God, especially in time of serious or terminal illness. It is not God who abandons us; it is us who so many times let Him slip away. Since God is a part of every moment of our lives from the time of our conception, it is only right that He be part of our birth into eternal life. Anointing of the Sick is anointing for everlasting life and the assurance that Christ gives us everything and takes nothing but our sins away. How lucky we are to be loved by God like that!

May God who is manifested in the Sacraments pour forth His abundant grace upon us!

Keeping God's Children Protected and Safe: The safe environment training of our children and youth is a key component in the Policy for the Protection of Children. Each year our schools and parishes are mandated to provide this training to all youth in catholic school and parish programs. Since 2003 over 200,000 children have received age-appropriate abuse prevention education. The diocese maintains a working relationship with agencies in each of our 13 counties to provide training for our youth in schools and parishes. In addition, the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth maintains a media library containing videos for schools and parishes to provide child abuse prevention education. From 2016-19 over 31,000 parents have also received child abuse prevention education.
