It's All in the Basket				
St. Therese of Lisieux made a point of going the extra mile in kindness towards those people who really got under her skin. It was part of her own brand of Everyday Stewardship — thanking God for all His creation, even the parts with which, in her own humanness, she struggled to cope. I think about this a lot when I challenge myself to give thanks for things that bother me and people who challenge me. When I do this, I envision Christ giving thanks over those insufficient loaves. How many of us would see that paltry little basket and kick a rock in frustration because we can't feed all our people? "You didn't give me enough, Lord! You didn't give me enough patience, enough money, enough creativity, enough stamina to be a good steward. If you had given me more, I could also give more!" In those moments of despair, we need to take a good look at the life God has given us. We need to look at the trials and the challenges and the shortcomings. The hopes that didn't pan out, the disappointments that keep cropping up. Somewhere therein lies what we need to be the steward God asks us to be, just as St. Therese's own stewardship was defined by the people she simply couldn't stand. God does not give us all we want. He does not give us all we ask for. He does us one better: He gives us all we need. It's all in the basket.

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

On the top right hand corner of my desk, sit two framed photographs. One was taken nearly 40 years ago; the other was snapped a little over 30 years ago. They have always been on my desk for the 14 years of my priestly ministry. The oldest one is my maternal grandfather, Leonard and me. I was taken in early 1983, when I was not yet 2 years old. Pap had just turned 61 that past October. He was sitting in the living room of the home he had shared with his wife, my grandmother, Josephine, for 30 years. I'm in a high chair. He's facing away from the camera, feeding me lunch. You can tell the cancer was wasting him away. He died on January 16, 1983. It is the only photograph of the two of us alone together. I cherish the image beyond words. I pray for him every day. The other photo is of a slightly older version of myself and my paternal grandfather Joseph (he lived to be 90 years old and died in 2016). The photo depicts me helping him mowing an embankment near my grandparents' house. Pap had tied a rope to the lawn mower and was pulling it up and down the bank to cut the grass. I was a mere little boy, not very strong physically, but still I wanted to lend a hand, as they say. So, there I am pulling on the end of the rope. We mowed that bank countless times in my childhood. Prayers are sent to him on a daily basis as well.

As for my grandmothers: Josephine, my mother's mother – her photograph is on my dresser. She vehemently disliked having her picture taken, but we often sneaked a shot or two. This one is her beaming from ear to ear the day I celebrated my first mass at Holy Trinity Church in Ramey, where she had been married in 60 years earlier. She too gets prayers each morning as I wake up. My dad's mom – Christina Pino – well you know I talk about her all the time. She's doing great at the young age of 95. I talk to her on the phone a few times a week. I talk to the other three of my grandparents too, but again that's in prayer.

I have been so very blessed to have all four of my grandparents (though some for a brief time) in my life in these past 40 years! Some, sadly, never knew their grandparents. Some, like so many of us, had such happy memories and forever hold these men and women in their hearts. Yes, the love of a grandparent is unique, special and certainly, irreplaceable.



This weekend our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has set aside, for the first time, a World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly. We will have a special blessing for grandparents at our three weekend masses. There will be prayer cards distributed to them also at the liturgies. Finally, on Monday, July 26 – the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the Grandparents of Jesus – we will celebrate mass at 6:00 p.m. At that mass, we will pray for all grandparents, especially for those who gone before us now, and we hope are basking in the eternal light of heaven.

There is not a day that goes by that I do not first of all think about my grandparents, but thank God for their presence not only in my life, but in the lives of my parents, whom they loved and raised in faithful Catholic

family, but in all my cousin's lives, whose love strengthened and united us for so many years, physically – and continues to sustain us spiritually today. I would imagine many of you could say the same.

This weekend, and especially on Monday's feast of the Lord's grandparents, dig some photos of your grandparents out of the albums, boxes, or drawers. Spend some time recalling their memories, their voices, and their love. If they are buried nearby, visit the cemetery. Wherever you may be, wherever they are now – stop and say a prayer for them. Remember, as we all do, to keep a special place in your heart for our grandmothers and grandfathers! Let us pray: God of love, we thank you for our wonderful grandparents. They bring such joy and happiness into our lives. Thank you for all the special times that we have with them. Please watch over them, protect them and care for them now. May they know your goodness and love always. Amen!


