### From the Pastor's Desk

#### REFLECTIONS ON THE WORDS OF POPE JOHN PAUL I: Part (IV)

My dear parish family:



Last Friday was the 44<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the election of Albino Luciani. By the time we gather next Sunday, the pope will be Blessed John Paul I. In this fourth week of reflections, I turn toward the end of the pope's earthly life before his sudden death on September 28, 1978. The day before his death the Holy Father held his last Wednesday General Audience. He, unlike popes before him, would often call up young people to dialogue as part of his catechesis to visitors. That day he called a fifth grader named Daniele (a photo of them talking that day is here in this article), who told the pope he'd like to stay in fifth grade instead of moving on to sixth grade. As our school students returned this week to their school studies, John Paul's words are very appropriate.

"YOU SEE DANIELE, THE LORD HAS PUT INSIDE US A STRONG DESIRE TO MAKE PROGRESS, TO ADVANCE. SOMEONE IN FIRST GRADE SAYS, 'JUST WAIT UNTIL I'M IN SECOND.' SOMEONE IN SECOND GRADE WANTS TO BE IN THIRD. AND IT'S THE SAME WITH GROWN-UPS TOO, YOU KNOW. EVERYONE WANTS TO ADVANCE. THE LORD HAS GIVEN US THIS STRONG DESIRE TO MAKE PROGRESS. LOOK. WE BEGAN LIVING IN CAVES, IN LAKE DWELLINGS, THEN IN HUTS, THEN WE PUT UP HOUSES, THEN PALACES, NOW THERE ARE SKYSCRAPERS. ALWAYS ADVANCING. THE LOVE OF GOD IS A KIND OF JOURNEY. WE MUST MAKE PROGRESS HERE TOO. 'LORD, MAKE ME LOVE YOU MORE AND MORE.' NEVER STOP. MAKE PROGRESS, WITH THE HELP OF GOD, IN LOVING GOD."

Pope John Paul never fails in explaining the extraordinary in such simple terms, but always circling back to link the ordinary and seemingly normal back to God – always back to God, like everything good in our lives. Every particle of our faith – every instance that we embrace the hope of Jesus Christ – each moment that we are aware (and even sometimes when we are unaware) of the piercing love of God penetrating our hearts – we need more! Yes, more. Is there any point in our faith journeys thus far, that we wouldn't have appreciated more faith – more hope – or more love? Certainly not. Remember the old commercial from the 1970s and 80s – "There's also room for Jello?" The same applies to God – to His Son – to the intercession of the angels and saints – to the promptings of the Holy Spirit – there is always more room in our hearts, minds, and souls for them to increase in us. It is comfortable to stay where we are in our lives – to stay sedentary, rather than the heavy lifting or long distances in life. Nevertheless, as Pope John Paul reminded young Daniele, progress is part of our journey not only on earth, but toward heaven – always toward God. This week let us ask God – let us ask John Paul I – for the strength to carry on – move forward – advance to an increase in faith, hope, and love – to progress one step closer to heaven.

In next week's bulletin, I want to share some final thoughts with John Paul's meditations on love. Finally today, here are some descriptions of the pope's funeral. This first description comes from an anonymous religious sister describing that afternoon of October 4, 1978: "DURING MASS, RAIN FELL IN TORRENTS AND ONLY LET UP A LITTLE WHEN IT WAS TIME TO DISTRIBUTE HOLY COMMUNION TO THE PEOPLE. THE LARGE PASCHAL CANDLE BESDIE THE CASKET FLICKERED, BUT IN SPITE OF THE RAIN, IT DID NOT GO OUT." Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, who attended the funeral as Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, remarked the following, when he was interviewed during the process for John Paul's beatification: "THE DAYS OF THE POPE'S FUNERAL WERE DAYS OF GREAT SADNESS FOR ME. THE MOOD WAS MATCHED BY THE POURING OF RAIN. EVEN NATURE SEEMED TO BE GRIEVING WITH US."

Next Sunday in Rome the same light of Christ that would not go out on that Paschal Candle 44 years ago will be emanating strongly from St. Peter's Square when Pope Francis declares Albino Luciani a blessed for the Church – one step closer to being called a saint, which I believe he will be shortly. Nature will rejoice that morning – the Church will rejoice that we will have one more holy person in heaven interceding for us.

Soon to be Blessed John Paul I, pray for us! Father Justin
