From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

I have mentioned before about the "secret prayers" said by the priest at mass. These silent moments of private prayer of the priest are 11 in number. Of these 11 prayers, the following three take on special significance on this second Sunday after Pentecost – The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ (Corpus Christi).



As the priest finishes the sign of the peace, he takes the host, breaks it over the paten, and drops a small piece of it in the chalice, saying: May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it. After we sing the Lamb of God, the priest will join hands and say quietly: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who, by the will of the Father and the work of the Holy Spirit, through your Death gave life to the world, free me by this, your most holy Body and Blood, from all my sins and from every evil; keep me always faithful to your commandments and never let me be parted from you. Finally, after the people respond: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be Then the priest will reverently consume the Body and Blood of Christ, saying: May the Body of Christ keep me safe for eternal life. Only after this prayer, the priest will consume the Body of Christ. Similarly, before drinking the Blood of Christ, the priest will say: May the Blood of Christ keep me safe for eternal life.

On the night before He died for us, Jesus revealed to His disciples how He perceived His human life, His bodily existence — a body broken for us, blood shed for us. In offering Himself as a sacrifice for us, Jesus passes through the horror of death and gives new life. Yes, that new life in only possible through the Eucharist that we share here every day. Yes, the Eucharist, can only be a source of grace for our lives if it is broken and shared – as is Jesus Himself.

In the Eucharist, Jesus calls us to value our weak and fragile human condition. He calls us to a conversion that means turning away from an approach to human life that wants to pretend we are invulnerable, that we can secure our safety by isolating from those who might make demands on us. We are invited to say "Amen" to a new way of living as we come forward to join in the Lord's supper every time we walk together again in the Communion line.

Every time we say "Amen," should give us pause and force us to reflect on what we are really declaring in saying that one simple, yet powerful word. It means that we are willing to be bread for others, to be broken for others and to be consumed by others. It means leaving behind a life that tries to disguise our humanity. It means opening ourselves to embrace our weaknesses so that we can relate to others on the deep level of feeling with them the human condition, the human struggle and darkness and anguish that call out for salvation.

All of this serves as a helpful reminder why we call the Eucharist "Holy Communion." Each time we receive Him in the Holy Bread of Life, let us continue to ask Him for strengthen to work together – to be in communion with each other – so we can receive the grace to save our souls – to help save the souls of others!

May the Body of Christ keep us safe for eternal life! Father

Quo Vadis Days



Peter's Pence Collection will be held the weekend of June 26, 2022.




