


From the Pastor's Desk

WAKE UP WORLD! ALL LIFE IS PRECIOUS!: the Fifth Commandment

Ten Commandments Series Part V of X

My dear parish family:

Nearly 40 years ago in a speech in New York City, the late Joseph Cardinal Bernardin of Chicago introduced the "seamless garment" approach to the conversation of pro-life activities. Using the biblical image of the garment worn by Jesus that the soldiers would not cut at the foot of the Cross, the cardinal connected various issues of life as one undivided crusade, if you will, to show how all abuses toward the dignity of human life must be defended. He connected poverty, euthanasia, nuclear war, abortion and other life issues into a consistent ethic of life at every stage and in every circumstance. So it begs the questions for our reflection this week on the fifth commandment.



Do I respect the inherent goodness and dignity of all human life?

God creates all life out of love, which is beyond all telling or human comprehension and makes it sacred. Here's what the catechism says: "God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning to its end: no one can under any circumstance claim for [oneself] the right directly to destroy an innocent human being" (2258).

Not only as Catholic Christians, but as fellow human beings are called to create a culture of life! The Fifth Commandment says "You Shall Not Kill." Those four words call us to foster the spiritual, physical, emotional, psychological, and social well-being of ourselves and others. It tells us that murder and any life-threatening acts are never an option. It calls us to recognize that our human freedom and conscience needs to be consistent with God's intention,

and follow along with the values that His Son taught us for the protection of human dignity, rather than what society or a select group of people would believe as a law. Remember human laws are usually not exactly in line with God's laws. (AKA – The Ten Commandments)

The CDC reported that between 1973, when the U.S. Supreme Court "legalized" abortion in Roe v. Wade, and 2014, more than 43 million abortions were reported to the CDC. This number does not account for unreported or self-induced abortions and those that occurred throughout the rest of the world. The Church has always condemned abortions and proclaims that the right to life begins at conception and continues until natural death. However, the Church extends its mercy and compassion to those persons who regret having had an abortion and to those facing difficult life situations in that regard. Here we see the seamless garment – a consistent ethic of life – but also we witness the inexhaustible mercy and love of God

Page through a daily newspaper. Watch the evening news. You can't miss it: murder, violence, poverty, abuse and neglect, injustice, abortion, drunk driving. Our world is filled with a seemingly endless array of assaults on the sanctity of life. It is so pervasive, in fact, that we've become almost hardened to the everydayness of it all. But then something happens—a tornado strikes a; tower falls; bullets riddle a grammar school; bombs explode—and once again, we are reminded that life is a precious gift that we are called to preserve and protect. We all know the Fifth Commandment: You shall not kill. On its face, it seems an easy commandment to keep. Let us pray that we can keep it always. Let's pray the world will wake up and respect the dignity of all human life – in all its stages – every day!

Here's a prayer then to say today: "O God, our Creator, all life is in your hands from conception until death. Help us to cherish our children and to reverence the awesome privilege of our share in creation. May all people live and die in dignity and love. Bless all those who defend the rights of the unborn, the handicapped and the aged. Enlighten and be merciful toward those who fail to love, and give them peace. Let freedom be tempered by responsibility, integrity and morality."

"Then God spoke all these words: 'I am the LORD your God.'" (Exodus 20:1-2) May we listen and love Him in new ways as our journey of faith continues!



Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Diocesan Child **Protection Policies:** The Diocese of Erie, along with all other dioceses in the United States, has policies and procedures in place to address the national problem of child abuse and to aid in maintaining safe environments. The three main components of the Policy for the Protection of Children are: screening of all employees and volunteers who work with minors, training of all youth, parents, employees and volunteers, and reporting all suspected child abuse. The diocese is committed to promptly reporting any suspected child abuse directly to ChildLine or law enforcement. The diocese requires on-going screening and training of all personnel, paid or unpaid, who have regular contact with our children and youth under the age of 18. The diocese also requires yearly safe environment training of our children, youth and parents regarding touching-safety and environments. 
