From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

Please indulge me for just a quick commercial this week!

So many visitors to our parish remark on how clean and orderly the church looks. I have been to many parishes in our diocese and others, and I agree Saint Leo Church is pristine. Why? Because you're the parishioners care about our buildings and we have a wonderful group of people to clean, namely The Altar Guild. I want to speak to you on behalf of these men and women, whose names you see in the bulletin every week, who beautify our worship space.

First I want to thank them for their willingness to serve our community in this way. Taking pride in the community of faith in which we belong is very special and necessary. Taking pride also in the environment in which we experience the sacred mysteries of the Eucharist, the celebration of the sacraments and fellowship with one another is equally important.

Therefore I am appealing to you to consider volunteering for the Altar Guild. It's a few hours or less of service. If we have more people in the rotation it would probably boil down to once a month. A number of people who had served in this capacity before have had to step away because of age and or illness. Again its one to one and a half hours of service every seven to eight weeks. Not a bad deal. Groups typically work on Thursday through Saturdays.

We have a number of out of town visitors on the weekends and at weddings and funerals who always compliment me on how beautiful the church look; my reply is always the same: the people love their church and they take care of it. Many parishes have two or one person who cleans their churches. Father Brian's parish in Erie Saint George - a 1000 family parish - has one person for cleaning the church. We have many TEAMS of people here at Saint Leo. So I ask you to join the team and continue the good work of preserving the integrity and beauty of God's House.

The Altar Guild duties include the following: dusting our beautiful woodwork; running the sweeper in the sacristies, main body of the church, and gathering space; cleaning the clear glass windows and doorways each week; dusting off the statues and crevices around the church; and quite frankly anything else you may notice that needs done. You can always work with your cleaning group or at your own convenience. We're lucky to have the church open during the day. Many places do not have that luxury

Our Altar Guild and our maintenance supervisor, Dan Bloam, do excellent jobs here at Saint Leo. We are lucky to have them. So be sure to thank them when you see them. Please think about joining us. For more information call Rena in the office (772.3135) and she will relay your message to Noel Murphy, our Altar Guild coordinator.

If God is all-good and all-powerful, then why is there evil? This is perhaps the most vexing challenge that non-believers pose to Christians. Our world of violence, greed, and suffering seems incompatible with the God of the Gospel. How can we answer the challenge?

In The *Problem of Evil*, Jimmy Akin tackles this most difficult of apologetics questions. He builds a biblical and philosophical case for understanding how God's perfections are not disproved by the existence of evil, but in fact allow for a world in which pain and sin may be mysteriously ordered by Providence towards a greater good. Jimmy offers valuable practical tips for discussing the question with skeptics, such as how to avoid certain well-meaning but incorrect answers Christians often give (plus the one thing you

should *never* say). He also gives you seven useful approaches you can take when people's faith (or your own) is shaken by suffering. Watch *The Problem of Evil* and learn how God's love does not fail in the face of evil, but shines through it and will triumph over it—in the world and in our lives.
