From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:



Every year on this Second Sunday of Advent we encounter a pivotal figure in the history of our salvation, who was the loud voice – the strong voice – the faithful voice that cries out in the desert even now over two thousand years later. He was the cousin of a young girl from Nazareth, who was only 15 years older than he, but had an irreplaceable role to play as well. His mother was thought to be barren and couldn't have children, but as we experience time and time again, "*for God nothing is impossible.*" His cousin who would be born just nine months or so later, would be the one to whom he would point to and later in the waters of the Jordan River baptize. That's how we know him: John The Baptist. He is often called in the Eastern tradition of the Church by a more fitting name – a more Advent name: *The Forerunner* – the One who Comes Before.

That was John the Baptist's entire life. He is conceived before Jesus. He is the first, before his parents – before his cousin's Joseph and Mary – before the Wise Men and Shepherds – before anyone else in the human race – he was the first to experience the joy of Jesus Christ. As the two cousins were *in utero*, he leapt for joy that the Savior was coming. Even then as a new life inside Elizabeth, he was readying himself – he was preparing the way – shouting out in the desert before birth – that Jesus Christ is the way, the truth and the life! He was then born before Jesus to get the people ready. He went into the desert long before Jesus would be tempted there for forty days, to rally the troops if you would, to get the excitement going. Finally, John will die before Jesus; be killed by cruel men – men who refused to see the light – ignored the shouts of salvation – would not be changed by God's touch. John is always a step in front Jesus, making sure all is ready – all is set in motion.

We, therefore, are all John the Baptists. That's our call every Advent. That is our Christian duty every day: to make the path straight – to get rid of all the stones and smooth out the bumps that could trip us up; to prepare the way – to be sure there is room in our hearts to welcome again the Son of God. However, we must be a voice crying out in the world, because the world has become quite desert-like hasn't it? So many voices shouting that they are the way – that they have the truth – that only with them can you have a wonderful life, but they lie! Without God's truth, without the way that John the Baptist shows us, without the life, the eternal life, that is only possible with Jesus Christ, nothing else matters. John shouted these truths twenty centuries ago to people who were in pain and sorrow – who were searching for meaning, for direction, for love. They shouted for God to come and save them.

God answered. God came. We shout today for the same things. Moreover, God will answer, because God is coming again! He arrives in about 14 days to shatter the darkness of the world. This week we must put on the camel hair – feast on wild locusts and honey – and convince others who might think we're crazy because we love Jesus Christ unconditionally, to make room for Him again in our homes and in our hearts.

Long before He came that first night in Bethlehem, Jesus Christ knew us – every single human person whom He came to save. The Child of the Manger who could not speak, knew our names already! God in His human form – The Messiah – The King of Glory, knew all our faces. Every line and curve, each beautiful and unique feature that His Father has created us in, was forever imprinted in Jesus' heart. There we are and there we will stay forever. *Come Lord Jesus, come quickly without delay!*

Let us give thanks for these past 150 years a
and move forward together as one family of faith in Christ!
