

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

In one of the guest rooms of the rectory I have atop a cabinet an old statue – actually is a combination of three statues of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the family we honor this weekend. For over 40 years, it stood on top of the heater in my aunt and uncle's living room. After my Aunt Mary died in 2003, it was given to me. I treasure it. All of us treasure little keepsakes from our family's past – meaningless or even worthless to others, but absolutely irreplaceable and priceless to us. Every time we see one of these treasures the memories of our loved ones, many times now gone to God, come rushing back with such tenderness. This happens to me when I look at my Holy Family statue.



Christmastime is one of those moments that nostalgia comes in full force. Families gather and stories of the past are told and re-told. Many of the stories we heard before and can many times repeat them verbatim, but it just doesn't seem like a family gathering without them. Let me share with you some brief stories about my aunt, uncle and cousin, whose statue I now possess.



My uncle was named Andrew, although we never called him that. He was Uncle Shine and he was a very hard worker (like St. Joseph) and provided for his family. He made sure that his wife and son would be protected and he did this to the best of his ability. The love he had for my aunt was tangible when you entered their home. His impeccable garden was legendary. He looked in physical appearance like my grandfather, his brother Leonard; and since my grandfather died when I was two, I always imagined that if he had lived, he would like just like Uncle Shine. He would drive me and my grandma to church on

Saturdays. We lived only a few blocks away, but always left 30 minutes early to pray. Uncle Shine left us off at the curb and parked the car; always arriving just as mass began. Until I was in my twenties, after he had died, I always thought it took him that long to park the car, but then realized he just waited in the car to listen to the baseball game scores!



Aunt Mary, my grandmother's sister and Uncle Shine's wife for 55 years was such a faithful and amazing woman (like the Blessed Virgin Mary). Her and my uncle lived next door to my grandparents (two brothers married two sisters). When my grandparents bought a new appliance, Aunt Mary brought it the next day; it was like mirror images. Her rosaries never left her side nor did her daily cup of tea. Her smile was infectious and her whisper of a voice was so gentle. She loved calling family on the phone and all of us felt the sting of sorrow in 2003 after she died and the phone calls went silent. The most endearing memory of Aunt Mary is when one of us nephews or nieces would try to say goodbye to her at the end of a visit. A

woman who never raised her voice in anger or frustration would bark at us and say, "Don't say goodbye, say I'll see you later!" It was that kind of hope that we will all see each other later (in heaven) that got her and my uncle through the most tragic moment of their lives.



That day of horror came on June 9, 1968 when their only child (like Jesus), my cousin Billy, drowned the day before his 20th birthday. Billy had just finished college and already had a job secured with Penn Dot as an architect, when he fell into a quarry in Tyrone. Billy never did learn how to swim. Even though my cousin died 13 years before I was born, I knew him through his parents. Every Saturday after 1968 until Aunt Mary died in 2003 a candle was lit for Billy at Holy trinity Church, their home parish. It was the light of hope – the light of Christ that never dimmed in their hearts. My uncle and aunt could have given up and blamed God for this tragedy and forgotten about church and the faith; but their faith got even

stronger because they both believed that they would see Billy later, and they did.

At Aunt Mary's funeral I offered the eulogy and I brought up the statue and I remarked that heaven now had two holy Families. Every father can find a steady companion in St. Joseph. Every mother can find a wonderful example in Mary of Nazareth. Every child can find trust in the person of Jesus Christ. Andrew, Mary and William Mick now live forever with the first Holy family. We too can do the same.....later. However, for now while we still can, show your family love, support, faith, hope and unity. In our world where the family has been so horribly abused and disfigured, let us be different. So gather some more as New Year's approaches and tells some family stories, dig out those mementoes and rejoice in one of the gifts of the stable....the family, our family!
