


From the Pastor's Desk

IV – Easter Reflection Series on the Paschal Candle: The Alpha & The Omega

My dear parish family:

The exact use of the Paschal candle has changed over the centuries. Initially it was broken up after the Easter Vigil and fragments were given to the faithful. Beginning in the 10th Century it was kept in a place of honor near the ambo (where the Gospel was proclaimed) until the Feast of the Ascension of Jesus, 40 days after Easter. By the time of the 12th Century, the candle began to be inscribed with the current year (which will be the subject of next week's reflection). Over time, the Paschal Candle grew in size to merit the description of "pillar," as sung in the Easter Proclamation at the Vigil. By 1550, some Paschal candles weighed as much as three hundred pounds, and, after they had been used, were melted into smaller candles to use at the funerals of the poor.

At the Easter Vigil, following the blessing of the new fire, I prepared the Paschal Candle for service. I used a small knife to cut into the wax – first into the Cross (that we meditated upon last week), then into the Alpha and Omega, and finally into the numerals of the year. Here is the prayer: *Christ yesterday and today* (cuts a vertical line in the Cross); *the Beginning and the End* (cuts a horizontal line in the Cross); *the Alpha* (cuts the Greek letter Alpha above the vertical line); *and the Omega* (cuts the letter Omega below the vertical line). *All time belongs to Him* (cuts the first numeral of the current year in the upper left corner of the Cross); *and all the ages* (cuts the second numeral of the current year in the upper right corner of the Cross). *To him be glory and power* (cuts the third numeral of the current year in the lower left corner of the Cross); *through every age and for ever. Amen* (cuts the fourth numeral of the current year in the lower right corner of the cross).



In the last book of the Bible – the Book of Revelation – Jesus speaks to us in the 25th chapter with these words: "BEHOLD!" He says. Behold – in Latin, ECCE! – in the original Greek – IDOU! – it means SEE! LOOK! HERE! 160 times in the New Testament, it's used – 25 times alone in the Book of Revelation. The Lord says: "Behold! I make all things new! I am the Alpha and the Omega – the Beginning and the End." Easter, at the same time, is an end and at the same time a beginning. We see an end to the darkness of death strangling humanity and casting us into the depths of the Netherworld; and because of the Resurrection, we experience the new life of Christ, as the doors of the heavenly kingdom are thrown open again to the faithful. Yes, the Alpha and the Omega – the Beginning and the End – Jesus Christ comes to create the world and us anew!

Some years ago in 2005, Pope Benedict XVI reminded us of the power of love and hope of the Risen Christ to overcome evil, just as eternal life conquers death. He said: "History is not in the hands of dark forces, of chance, or of merely human choices. The Lord, supreme arbiter of historical events, rises

above the discharge of evil energies, the vehement onslaught of Satan, the emergence of plagues and wickedness. He knowingly guides history to the dawn of the new heaven and the new earth."

Jesus is making us new! Moreover, Jesus doesn't force us to do anything, does He? He doesn't force us to be His witness – we choose Him to be new. He doesn't force us to be the best we humanly can be – we choose Him to be new. He doesn't force us to be Christian Catholics, with all that entails – we choose Him to be new. We allow ourselves to be touched by the Alpha and the Omega – Him who makes all things – all people new.....because we believe! We believe – you believe and I believe – in Jesus' power – in Jesus' love – in Jesus' wonderful way of making things new. He will make our world – our lives – our families – our road on this Easter journey new. And what we've all experienced in these past 14 months – newness is exactly what we need!

May these 50 days of Easter light bring us hope and joy! - Father Justin


