From the Pastor's Desk

#### VI – Easter Reflection Series on the Paschal Candle: Five Grains of Incense

My dear parish family:

On this last official Sunday of the Easter season, we conclude our reflections on the beauty and depth of the Paschal Candle. After masses are concluded on the Solemnity of Pentecost, next Sunday, the candle will make its way to the gathering space, but it importance – hopefully gleaned from these reflections – will remain with us the whole year round.

Let's take one more trip back to the Easter Vigil when I prepared the candle in the back of the church. When the cutting of the cross and of the other signs had been completed, I took five grains of incense, which are encased in wax and have pin-like prongs, and I inserted them directly into the candle in the form of a cross. These five incense pieces recall the five wounds inflicted upon the Lord's body – by the nails inserted into the hands and feet of Jesus that attached Him to the Holy Cross on Calvary. I prayed: "By his holy and glorious wounds, may Christ the Lord guard us and protect us. Amen."



Holy Smokes! When I was a seminarian serving mass at the Cathedral and many of the young altar servers who have assisted at mass in all my assignments, always fought over who was selected to be the *thurifer* – that's the server in charge of the incense! John of Patmos, who scholars confer the authorship of the Book of Revelation, saw clearly that the

offering of incense was a beautiful symbol of prayer. The final book of the Bible indicates, "*The twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. Each of the elders held a harp and gold bowls filled with incense, which are the prayers of the holy ones.*" The smoke of the incense, together with the prayers of God's people, rise up before God from our places of worship all over the world.



So too Jesus Christ was raised up on the Cross and endured not only five wounds on His holy hands and feet, but all over His sacred body. In his homily at a morning Mass March 20, 2018, our Holy Father, Pope Francis shared this on the wounds of Jesus, signified on the Paschal Candle with the five grains of incense: "Look. Look at the wounds. Enter in to the wounds. By those wounds we were healed. Do you feel bitter, feel sad, feel life just isn't going the right way and you're also ill? Look there. In silence. Sometimes artists want to focus more on Jesus' post-resurrection glory, so they will make a crucifix of gold and adorn it with jewels. But when one is feeling lost or frightened or in pain, look at a crucifix before the glory and recognize how Jesus annihilated himself to defeat evil and death."

Yes, Easter – the Ascension, last week, and Pentecost, next Sunday, show us and prove to us that Jesus endured so much to free us from evil and death, and therefore

win for us the glory and redemption of eternal life. All the components of the Paschal Candle point us toward this reality – this desire of all Christians.

After the candle was ready, that night of the Easter Vigil, the final prayers the priest says begins thus: "*May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.*" Then the procession begins down the darkened aisle of the church. The anthem is sung loudly: <u>"THE LIGHT OF CHRIST!</u>" Everyone responds with joy: <u>"THANKS BE TO GOD!"</u> These prayers not just for the Easter Vigil, but every day of our shared Christian journey. The light of Jesus is always with us, even the Easter Candle is moved out of the sanctuary.

In their wonderful little book, <u>The Smiling Pope: The Life and Teachings of Pope John Paul I</u>, Raymond and Lauretta Seabeck describe the popes funeral, culminating the world's shock when he died after only 33 days in office in 1978. "*The funeral was on October 4 in the late afternoon. During Mass, rain fell in torrents and only let up a little when it was time to distribute Holy Communion to the people. The large paschal candle beside the casket flickered, but in spite of the rain, it did not go out.*" In our lives, there are calm and sunny days and then the rain torrents come and we fear we may drown in darkness or despair. Remember the paschal Candle – remember the Light of Christ in our hearts. At times, it may seem to flicker, but it will not go out!

## Vatican adds seven invocations to Litany of St. Joseph

The Vatican's divine worship office announced Saturday the addition of seven new invocations to the Litany of St. Joseph.

The seven invocations, in Latin, are Custos Redemptoris, Serve Christi, Minister salutis, Fulcimen in difficultatibus, Patrone exsulum, Patrone afflictorum, and Patrone pauperum.

The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments wrote a letter to the presidents of bishops' conferences May 1, the feast of St. Joseph the Worker, explaining the inclusion of the new invocations.

"On the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, published the Apostolic Letter *Patris corde*, with the aim 'to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal," the congregation said.

"In this light," it added, "it appeared opportune to update the Litany in honor of Saint Joseph, approved by the Apostolic See in 1909, by integrating seven new invocations drawn from the interventions of the Popes who have reflected on aspects of the figure of the Patron of the Universal Church." The additions to the Litany of St. Joseph were approved by Pope Francis.

The bishops' conferences will be responsible for the translation and publication of the updated litany in their local languages, the divine worship congregation stated. Bishops' conferences can also, according to their own prudential judgement, introduce other invocations by which St. Joseph is honored in their countries.

A litany is a type of repetitive, petitionary prayer, often invoking the intercession of the saints or the Virgin Mary under different titles approved by the Church.

The new invocations of St. Joseph can be translated in English as Guardian of the Redeemer, Servant of Christ, Minister of Salvation, Support in Difficulties, Patron of Refugees, Patron of the Afflicted, and Patron of the Poor.
