

From the Pastor's Desk

II: VISITING THE LORD!

Advent Reflection Series on The Five Joyful Mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary

My dear parish family:

Last week we reflected in the bulletin and in the weekend homily the first mystery of joy – announcing the Lord – how we can become more consistent, constant, and authentic sharers of the Good News of Jesus Christ and His message to those around us. On this Second Sunday of Advent, as we light the second purple candle on our wreaths, we look at The Visitation, when a pregnant Mary traveled to be with her pregnant cousin Elizabeth.

We read from Sacred Scripture: <u>Luke 1:42-44</u> – "Elizabeth was filed with the Holy Spirit and cried out in a loud voice: 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb...The moment your greeting sounded in my ears, the babe in my womb leapt for joy.'"

Let us reflect now: More often than not, we meet people by chance, or so we think it is by chance, yet these relationships are connections instituted by God. He guides us in our lives to meet other – to visit them – and we make connections that last a lifetime. These meetings, visits, and connections, occur o that they help each other on their journey. As cousins, Mary and Elizabeth share a bond of family. However, they also share a spiritual relationship because of



how the Holy Spirit is acting in their lives, fashioning the Messiah (Jesus) and His prophet (John the Baptist) deep inside their wombs. During those months, Mary and Elizabeth don't just sit around waiting. They are working, preparing for Elizabeth's baby, quietly conversing, and praying. Together, they are like a little parish community, like us. In our lives, God gives us spiritual friendships that help us grow closer to Him, both with our family and friends. Sometimes He links our lives together for a larger purpose that will reveal itself with time, or eventually in heaven. This week, let us ask Mary to help us and our spiritual friends to listen carefully for God's gentle whisper, so that we can walk with him and with each other.

Each week I will end my meditation with the words of Saint John XXIII. They come from a retreat he offered on the joyful mysteries around 1961: What tenderness and gentleness there was in that three-month visit of Mary to her beloved cousin. Both are custodians of an imminent maternity, but for Mary, it is to be the most sacred maternity imaginable. What sweetness of harmony in those two intertwining hymns. From one, "Blessed are you among women" (Luke 1:42), and from the other, "He has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely from now on all generations will call me blessed" (1:48). This vision at Ain-Karim, a few miles west of Jerusalem, illuminates with a heavenly light (at the same time very human!) the relations of good families brought up in the ancient school of the Rosary recited each evening in the home among the members of the family. This is done in all parts of the world where people are called by the lofty inspiration of the priesthood or where one is called by missionary charity or the apostolate or even by lawful motives of different natures, such as work, military service, study, teaching, and the like. What a beautiful coming together this is in which, during the recitation of the ten Hail Mary's of this mystery, so many souls are united by the bond of blood, by domestic bonds, by all those things which sanctify and strengthen the sentiments of love among those closest to one another-parents and children, brothers, sisters, relatives, neighbors, citizens-united in an act which supports and illuminates universal charity, the practice of which is the joy and honor of life.

This Advent may we wait in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus!

Synod: Key Term #2 What is synodality?

The Church has been holding synods since ancient times. While the concept of synodality is old, the word "synodality" is very new. It means the entire People of God assembling together, journeying together, and actively participating in the evangelizing mission of the Church. Pope Francis is calling us to recognize synodality as the way the entire Church operates. Everone is involved, everyone contributes. In particular, it means listening to each other and not remaining oblivious in our own bubbles. Synodality is not only for internal affairs, but also manifests the Church's universal and missionalry nature to the world. Hopefully this Synod on Synodality will help us to better understand and live out this emerging concept.

What is the Synod on Synodality?

Pope Francis has asked the entire world to participate in a synod on the topic "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission." The central question he asks of everyone is:

A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together." How is this "journeying together" happening today in our diocese? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our "journeying together"?

You may be invited to participate in listening sessions at your local parish, or you may wish to give your input online. Participation in a synod should always involve prayer, listening, discussion, and above all, discerning the way that the Holy Spirit is guiding us. Hopefully these questions and answers can help you as you prepare you input.


