

We pray for the spread of peace and non violence, by decreasing the use of weapons by States and citizens.



From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:



HAPPY HOLY WEEK! It is truly the greatest seven days of the entire year, especially the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday – Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. Please make time to join our community in praying during these holiest of liturgies. They are beautiful. They are powerful. Join us for all three!

Earlier this month our Holy Father Pope Francis marked a decade from his election as Successor of Peter – the Vicar of Christ on Earth – the Universal Pastor of the Church. To recall his tenth anniversary of as Chief Shepherd, I wanted to share with you a brief excerpt from the pope's homily on his first Palm Sunday back in 2013.

As we enter into Holy Week, let us take to heart, our individual prayer at home and especially our communal prayer here this week, his words concerning today:

Jesus enters Jerusalem and loud praises are heard: "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" (Lk 19:38) Crowds, celebrating, praise, blessing, peace: joy fills the air. He understands human sufferings, he has shown the face of God's mercy, and he has bent down to heal body and soul.

This is Jesus. This is his heart which looks to all of us, to our sicknesses, to our sins. The love of Jesus is great. And thus he enters Jerusalem, with this love, and looks at us. It is a beautiful scene, full of light - the light of the love of Jesus, the love of his heart - of joy, of celebration.

At the beginning of Mass, we too repeated it. We waved our palms, our olive branches. We too welcomed Jesus; we too expressed our joy at accompanying him, at knowing him to be close, present in us and among us as a friend, a brother, and also as a King: that is, a shining beacon for our lives. Jesus is God, but he lowered himself to walk with us. He is our friend, our brother. He illumines our path here. And in this way we have welcomed him today. Jesus, in our midst; it is born from knowing that with him we are never alone, even at difficult moments, even when our life's journey comes up against problems and obstacles that seem insurmountable, and there are so many of them! And in this moment the enemy, the devil, comes, often disguised as an angel, and slyly speaks his word to us. Do not listen to him! Let us follow Jesus! We accompany, we follow Jesus, but above all we know that he accompanies us and carries us on his shoulders. This is our joy, this is the hope that we must bring to this world. Please do not let yourselves be robbed of hope! Do not let hope be stolen! The hope that Jesus gives us.

My friends and co-workers, let us experience the joy of meeting Christ in these days. May we have the love with which we must look to the foot of the Cross, the enthusiasm of the full hearts with which we must follow Jesus during this Holy Week, the upcoming season of Easter, and indeed throughout our lives. May it be so! May this be a great Holy Week for all of us!


Saint Leo Confirmation


