

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

I know many of you enjoy reading my reflections, but I've been feeling a bit under the weather and my good old brain just doesn't want to kick in, so I thought I would give you someone else's reflections, as a momentary change of pace. During these continuing to be troublesome times, I think its beneficial to stop and reflect on new insights and new ways of spiritual growth. Going back to basics and meditating on seemingly simple questions can help our faith journey. *What is the Church?* Is one of those questions. Henri de Lubac can offer us some insight. He is one of my favorite theologians – the French priest and later cardinal. Named by Saint John Paul II. Henri de Lubac (1896-1991) is considered to be one of the greatest theologians of the 20th Century and whose writings, thinking and research play a key role in the shaping of the Second Vatican Council. He wrote extensively on the Church – that's Church with a big "C" – meaning all of us – the believers and professors of Christ throughout the world. The Church is not just a parish here and there – the true Church – the mystical Body of Christ – is you and me and billions of other Catholic Christians all over the world. Here is just a sampling of the plethora of beautiful meditations de Lubac offered concerning the Church – our Church – the Church of Christ.

He writes of the Church in terms of a mother – how appropriate during this month of October as we honor the Mother of God – our Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. And I personally echo these beautiful words of Father de Lubac:

"Much more, the entire Church, without distinction, that immense flock of Christians, so many of whom are unaware of their royal priesthood and of the fraternal community they constitute, all this is my mother too. In this community I find my support, my strength and my joy."

"It was here that I first met the Church, at the knees of my earthly mother, and ever since it is here I still best recognize her through the mist of mere events and situations that in the long run defy analysis. Her experience, she tells me, has been the means, down the centuries, of increasing her perception of the sacred truth revealed to her. I too can tell her that my experience, modest and restricted though it be, has allowed me -- as it has each of her faithful -- to perceive precisely this, that she is my mother. This word which, as I say, is the first, preeminently the child's word, is also the word that best resumes whatever perception the adult achieves into the nature of man himself."

"The Church is my mother because she brought me forth to a new life. She is my mother because her concern for me never decreases; any more than do her efforts to deepen that life in me, however unenthusiastic my co-operation. And though in me this life may be a fragile and timid growth, I have seen its full flowering in others. I have seen it. I have touched it. I can, and will, vouch categorically for it. I am not deaf to the reproaches directed against my mother (truth to tell there are times when I am deafened by them), nor do I fail to see the justice of some of them. But I assert that before the evidence I have just presented all of them — and any others you care to add — are without force and will always remain so. Just as the Church is entirely concentrated in the Eucharist, it may also be said to be entirely concentrated in a saint."

"Happy those who from childhood have learnt to look on the Church as a mother! Happier still those whose experience, in whatever walk of life, has confirmed its truth! Happy those who one day were gripped by (and whose appreciation of it ever grew) the astonishing newness, richness and depth of the life communicated to them by this mother!"

May we ALL hold close to our Mother – the Church! Amen.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

January 24, 2021

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts. Later in the afternoon, he experienced a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the emergency department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist, having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.

We all have our wake-up calls. We have experiences and encounters that force us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our needs to lure us into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is a self we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

We spin our wheels, naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But, we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of us. In order to heed his invitation, we must leave our ego-self behind and follow.

When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well.
