

From the Pastor's Desk

Life Beyond Life: 2021 Easter Message

My dear parish family:

For us human beings death is always tragic and full of anguish. Everything in our being cries out for life without end, but this cannot stop the inevitable mechanism of death which approaches each day. St. Paul cries out: "Who will free me from this mortal body?" And He answers himself and us in our sorrow: "Thanks be to God for our Lord Jesus Christ!"

It's surprising, but the pure essence of Christianity can be found in that phrase: "Thanks be to God for our Lord Jesus Christ!" It testifies to the great fact that someone freed us from death. In somebody life proved itself stronger than death and introduced a greater beauty than we could ever imagine. This is the primary meaning of the Resurrection, as a kind of life no longer threatened by sickness or death. Therefore the resurrection cannot just be seen as the resuscitation of a corpse — like Lazarus, for example — but as a revolution in our humanness! This affirms that mortal life has been transfigured – changed not ended!

As we celebrate and truly rejoice with every fiber of our being that **JESUS CHRIST IS RISEN** – Present Tense! – HE HAS TRULY DESTROYED DEATH AGAIN: May this Easter – these 50 days and nights of the most intense of all divine light and love – overpower all of us and repossess our hearts! May the Risen Lord in all His wonder and awesome beauty be with you, your family and friends – and indeed to every single human person in our world, especially those who are still sufferings in the midst of the pandemic. Nevertheless, as it was at Easter in 1919, after the last global pandemic – as it was at Easter in 1946 following the terrible second worldwide war and atomic bomb detonations – as it was at Easter 2002 following 9/11 – as it was last Easter in 2020, when our churches were empty – so it is this Easter: **The Tomb is empty! Let us rejoice and be glad! ALLELUIA!!!!**

Here is my Easter Prayer for us this year. Pray it at dinner – pray it tonight before bed – pray it every day for these 50 days of joy:

Let us pray, on this Easter morning for the life that never again shall see darkness. God our Father, creator of all, today is the day of Easter joy. This is the morning on which the Lord appeared to those who had begun to lose hope and opened their eyes to what the scriptures foretold: that first he must die, and then he would rise and ascend into his Father's glorious presence. May the risen Lord breathe on our minds and open our eyes that we may know him in the breaking of bread, and follow him in his risen life. Grant this through Christ our Lord.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Child Abuse Prevention Month - Reporting known or suspected child abuse is everyone's responsibility: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the current Pennsylvania state report there wre 5,202 substantiated reports of child abuse in Pennsylvania during 2019. 2,087 or 40% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1,448 were physical abuse. To report suspected abuse of a minor, call Childline at 1 -800-932-0323 (anytime 24/7). A Happy Ending Isn't the Whole Story

"Is there a happy ending?"

When my kids were young, we never made it past the first whiff of any narrative tension before I got this question. As soon as whatever princess or furry woodland animal who was the hero of the story got into any small scrape, they wanted that reassurance, "Is there a happy ending?"

I can't say I blame them. Don't we all feel that way sometimes? We enter into a relationship with someone or some situation, and we just want to protect ourselves. We want to know it's not going to go badly — or, if it does, that we will be able to come back from it. It's a human instinct, a reflex. Our inclination to protect ourselves makes it so that we sometimes want to press fast-forward on the bad stuff and skip straight ahead to the happily-ever-after.

Easter is the ultimate happy ending. It's the day of miracles. The day when all the stones roll away and all the sins are forgiven. It's the day that puts everything right.

But if we learned anything from this week — from the Passion and death of the Lord — it's that we can't press fast-forward on the hardships of life. That tension, that loss, that fear — it's crucial, isn't it? As Catholics, we are who we are because of Easter. But Easter doesn't happen without Good Friday.

So, does the story of salvation have a happy ending? We know it does. But we also remember that the ending isn't all that matters.


