

From the Pastox's Wesk

My dear parish family:

Don't forget to join us at the festival this weekend. I will either be at the beer tent or the funnel cake line! See you there. In the mean time I want to share with you two items I came across recently. First is a letter to the editor from the *Erie Times-News* on prayer in schools – very interesting; and secondly, a prayer for the clergy sexual abuse that has plagued our Church. It was used last year at a service of forgiveness and healing in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis attended by the bishops of our country. I hope both articles stimulate some thought and prayer for all of us. Let's keep praying for each other without ceasing!

"We need to bring prayer back to our schools. This country was founded by God-fearing people as evidenced by: "In God we trust" printed on our money; "One nation under God" in our Pledge of Allegiance; and references to God inscribed on many buildings in our country's capital. The division of church and state was meant to keep the government from dictating to the people what church they must attend, as England had done. Our forefathers intended that each person should have the right to choose a religious denomination. It was never meant to eliminate God from our schools, our workplace or our lives. If we put guns in schools, even as a defensive mechanism, then our children see guns as the means by which to accomplish a goal. They will be deceived into thinking that whoever has the gun has the power. But through prayer, we acknowledge the power of God and come into relationship with him, who by his very nature is love. Our children need to know that they are loved by the God who created them. They need to know that they have value and that all human life is so very precious. They need hope for a better future. By having prayer in the schools, it would show our children that God is a priority to the people of this country. If you agree with this, please write a letter or send an email to a senator or a congressman — both can propose new legislation. Each of us can make a difference but we need to act and we need to act now."
