From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

Though he was pope for only 33 days and before I was even born I have always had a fondness for the man history now calls *Il Papa Sorriso* – The Smiling Pope – John Paul I. At times Bishop Albino Luciani was approached by simple faithful who asked him out of pious curiosity what title of Our Lady he liked best. Without satisfying their curiosity he would reply with a twinkle in his eye, ***“If you would let me give you some advice, may I suggest that you have devotion to Our Lady of the Pots and Pans, or Our Lady of the Broom. You see, Our Lady became a saint as a simple wife, washing the dishes, preparing meals, peeling the potatoes, or things like that.” “What I was trying to tell them,” he explained to his priests, “was that, yes, they should have great devotion to Our Lady, they must pray to her and have great confidence in her, but above all, they must imitate her virtues.”***

That’s good advice – to imitate Mary’s virtues. I doubt any of us here will ever be assumed body and soul into heaven, so we can’t very well imitate that Marian trait; but we can imitate and live out the great faith – the total giving of ourselves to God’s plan – to trust the love of Christ without question like Mary. That’s doable. That’s possible – very possible for you and me.



When Pope Francis, then Jorge Mario Bergoglio, was studying in Germany, he was stunned by a Bavarian painting of “Holy Mary, Our Lady Untier of Knots.” He acquired a copy of the painting and brought it to Argentina and promoted devotion to Mary under this title. By her obedience to God’s grace, she unties for herself and all of us, the knots of sin that Eve entangled for herself and all her children; and in a beautiful way it illustrates how she, along with all the saints in light help us to solve the knotty problems that we so often get ourselves caught up in.

This is a wonderful Marian devotion for all of us to take up on this Solemnity of the Assumption. No jaw-dropping miracles; no thunder and lightning; no feats of spiritual heroism—just the patient, painstaking, dogged untying of knots. That’s what all of us do every day. We get knotted up and need to untie them – sometimes we make the knots too tight – sometimes the arthritis and weakness of our human hands make it necessary to ask for help. Mary? Jesus? Joseph? Your guardian angel? God? That’s a start! How about your parents, your children, your friends, perhaps even a stranger that will become, by helping with the untying, a new friend? Sounds like a plan to me!

Let me leave you with this special prayer to Our Lady, Undoer of Knots:

Virgin Mary, Mother of fair love, Mother who never refuses to come to the aid of a child in need, Mother whose hands never cease to serve your beloved children because they are moved by the divine love and immense mercy that exists in your heart, cast your compassionate eyes upon me and see the snarl of knots that exist in my life.

You know very well how desperate I am, my pain and how I am bound by these knots.

Mary, Mother to whom God entrusted the undoing of the knots in the lives of his children, I entrust into your hands the ribbon of my life. No one, not even the Evil One himself, can take it away from your precious care. In your hands there is no knot that cannot be undone.

Powerful Mother, by your grace and intercessory power with Your Son and my Liberator, Jesus, take into your hands today this knot (...). I beg you to undo it for the glory of God, once for all. You are my hope.

***O my Lady, you are the only consolation God gives me, the fortification of my feeble strength, the enrichment of my destitution and with Christ the freedom from my chains.
Hear my plea. Keep me, guide me, protect me, O safe refuge!***

Mary, Undoer of Knots, pray for us.
Yes! O Queen Assumed into Heaven today, pray for us – Amen!

Dear Parents and Guardians of future altar servers,

It has been some time since we have seen servers assisting at Mass on the altar. We are finally in the position to resume this important ministry for young children, providing them an opportunity to serve our Lord while deepening the roots of their faith during the holy sacrifice of the Mass. As with everything else in the world, changes and adjustments will be occurring in the altar training program. Father Justin is offering a **mandatory** training session for **ALL** servers, both old and new, to orient everyone to new methods while teaching beginners the steps of the way. All children who have made their First Holy Communion are eligible. The training session will be on **TUESDAY, AUGUST 24 from 6 - 7 PM** in the body of the church. A second session will be offered at a later date if needed. If you and your child/children are interested in this ministry, please arrive ten minutes early so that I may record names and give a brief introduction beforehand. As a side note, in the event that missing class time is a concern, the children will no longer be serving weekday Masses with the exception of holy days, special events, and Friday (whole school) liturgies.
