From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

I trust you enjoyed Father McElrath last weekend while I was away at the basketball tournament, which I am so proud to say Saint Leo School won! I am sure Father Ian gave you a wonderful homily, but I wanted to share with you my homily I preached at my old parish in Oil City last week. This week will be part one and will conclude in next week's bulletin.

Why are we here? We aren't here because of a building – or a priest's personality – or a convenient mass time? No, I'm here – you're here because we love Jesus Christ. Right? We love and need this celebration of the Eucharist. It brings us into communion with the universal church, with the church throughout the 13 counties of the Diocese of Erie and the church of our fellow Catholics here in the city. It should console and challenge us to proclaim God's Word, and it feeds us when we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The Mass is a most important experience for all of us.

But there's a little phrase in the liturgy that bothers me. It's what bothered the prophet Isaiah, when he questioned his ability to follow God; it bothered Saint Paul, when he lamented that he had been born "abnormally" as he persecuted the Church; it bothered Peter, as he looked at Jesus and said, "Depart from, me Lord, for I am sinful man." Here's the little phrase: Lord, I am not worthy that you should come under my roof." It makes me ponder, wonder, and pray: Lord, why are we not worthy?"

With all respect to the liturgical traditions of our Church, I cannot help but challenge the assumption that we or anyone is unworthy to approach the table of the Lord. In Chapter 1 of Genesis we are reminded that God declares the intention to create humanity in His own image and likeness Yes, we are made in the image of Love. The author of Genesis then affirms that everything Love made is good — God looked at all He had done — that He had created and declared it very good!" So, if we are all created in God's image, and we are all good because we are Love's creations, made out of the same spiritual stuff — how can we be unworthy?

But what about the sin of Adam and Eve in the garden? Doesn't the stain of original sin make us all unworthy, when humanity fell from grace at the whisper of the serpent? Isn't original sin a state of unworthiness, imprinted on our souls like an ugly birthmark carried from generation to generation, washed away at the moment of our Baptism? That brings us to the "chicken and egg" question: Are we all basically good people who are capable of sinning or basically sinful people who have the capacity to do good? God's act of creating us in Love's own image must trump our ability to tarnish that image by sinning (and sadly we humans are very good at doing this). We are always worthy in God's eyes, even when we sin. Right?

Jesus spoke with, ate with, healed, fed, raised from death, commissioned, and gave positions of authority to men and women without any regard for their worthiness; whether they be tax collectors, prostitutes, pharisees or unbelievers. Many of them, according to our so-called standards of today, would be judged very unworthy of the task! The apostles themselves wouldn't make it past the interview today! Yet, Jesus showed God's love and compassion to anyone who needed him. They were worthy, because they had the ability to change for the good; to work together by following Him to the eternity of heaven, even if that meant carrying the Cross.........
