


Food Bank Collection Week:

Here are a few tips to teach kids that will help keep them safe when you are not with them at home: Teach children to never answer the door if home alone. Don't tell anyone, on the phone, on social media or while gaming, that your parents are not home. Do not allow friends into the home without the permission of a parent or babysitter. <u>BREAD FOR THE WORLD</u> <u>LETTER WRITING</u>

We will be writing to Congress representatives for <u>NATIONAL HUNGER</u>. More than 12 million children in the United States are not getting enough food. We will be asking them to do things like expanding free school

meals through the Community Eligibility Provision Program and extend it through the summer nationwide.

You have an opportunity to write to Congress representatives about <u>WORLD HUNGER</u>, as well. There are 811 million people worldwide that lack sufficient food. By next year, 14 million children are expected to be severely malnourished.

We will be asking Congress to cosponsor Global Malnutrition Prevention and Treatment Act, and to increase global nutrition funding. These issues will escalate as the war in Ukraine continues. Grain prices will rise as much as 50% in some countries because Russia and Ukraine account for more that 25% of the world's exported wheat.

Petitions and sample letters for our representatives and congressmen will be available in the gathering space. Please stop next week and do your part.



EUCHARISTIC PROCESSIONS

All parishioners are invited to participate in one of four Eucharistic processions scheduled in the Diocese of Erie on SUNDAY, JUNE 19. Be part of this national event as we enter into a three-year Eucharistic Revival for the Catholic Church in the United States, renewing devotion and belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The processions begin at 1:00 PM at the following locations: St. Peter Cathedral, Erie, St. Bernard Church, Bradford, St. Catherine of Siena Church, DuBois, Notre Dame Church Hermitage.

The blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration following the last morning Mass at each site. All processions return to the church to conclude with Benediction. For more information, contact the parishes hosting each procession.
