A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

As we are on this barreling straightaway heading into both the holiday season and The Advent Season, I just wanted to give you a heads up about the Christmas Mass times. This year, with the Fourth Sunday of Advent falling on Dec 24, Christmas Eve, it's going to be the shortest possible Advent and the longest day in my life :) ! Bishop has asked parishes to limit to no more than two Masses that evening, so we needed to cut back from last year - which, honestly, is something I would've been in favor of anyway. Just so you can begin your family Christmas planning if you have things to plan that evening, our Christmas Masses will be: Dec 24 at 4:30PM (Saint Michael) and 7:00PM (Saint Margaret); then Dec 25 at 12AM Midnight (Saint Michael) and 9:00AM (Saint Michael). We're still in mid-November, but Christmas is only 6 weeks away! So, I hope knowing the times early is helpful to you planning your Christmas plans. Note - Christmas Eve Mass does NOT satisfy your Sunday obligation for the 4th Sunday of Advent...like I said, longest day!

A few weeks back, I wrote about the time I was able to visit the Holy Land and what a profound experience it was - spiritually, culturally, and just broadening my sense of reality in that part of the world. A few of you have shared that you, too, have been over there and how meaningful and profound that was for you, as well. I was actually looking into going back over there at some point, and maybe making a parish pilgrimage opportunity. I don't think that is plausible any time soon - I'm not sure what is happening with those many hundreds of thousands who have pilgrimages booked and paid for through various tour agencies...I would suspect travel insurance agencies are paying out a ton of cash right now. Among all the other atrocities occurring in that land right now, Christians in particular are being deprived of the opportunity to walk and pray where Christ did. I know, in the scheme of things, that is near the bottom rung of the list for what is painstaking right now, but I was contemplating in prayer that, largely, those sites are and will be going - into the Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter seasons over the coming months - will be largely absent of foreign tourists, visitors, and pilgrims. Again, big deal, there are bigger fish to fry - I know, but it got me thinking about those places being largely abandoned (I would assume) and how that relates to our Christian and Spiritual lives.

At the end of the day, if we take our life with Christ seriously, and if we, with great desire, engage in the spiritual and charitable life, then we will necessarily find ourselves isolated or abandoned or not with those who may have once been with us. This happens because evil is real; sin is real; not everyone will believe and love like you believe and love. The further up the mountain we go, the more others will give up the journey with us for lack of perseverance and spiritual stamina. Even though we are becoming holier and more illuminated with the Grace of God...those that we love may still walk away or, at the very least, not understand us. Because we are striving to live sinless and pure lives, because we are staying clear of the enemy, because we are worshiping and praying more hours of the day than we once had, because we seek to become poor so others may become rich...because of all these movements of the fallen world and the Spirit of God, we may and probably will end up isolated and abandoned when compared to where we once were. This is why the community of the Church - and the Parish - is so integral to the life of the Christian. The community makes the abandonment bearable and with their assistance and encouragement, we can persevere together up the mountain of God.

This isn't all to say that the Christian life is miserable - quite the contrary! Though people may drift or pull away because of the Grace working within us, we become so connected to Christ! I used the Holy Land as an analogy. In that land, Our Lord experienced profound abandonment and isolation from those He knew and loved. But, it was in that He became and accomplished what He was desirous of doing! This, too, is our life in Christ. The more we are in conformity to Christ, the more we will experience all that He did - even that loneliness or abandonment. But, we also know that it is in those moments we are most connected to the Saints, to The Holy Trinity, and to each other who are on this same journey together. May we be people who continue to persevere and support each other in this challenging, yet so amazing life we find in Christ and His Church.
