A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

Saint Michael Parish 3rd Quarter Fiscal Report July 1, 2023 – Mar 31, 2024

From the above report, three-quarters of the way through our fiscal year, we are sitting on a hefty \$101,199 margin of safety! Looking at these numbers, three things contribute to that: 1) your offertory is simply through the roof generous, 2) fish dinner profit is in there, and 3) there has been quite a few bequests and large gifts / memorials that have come in. To address the first point, I am humble that you love the parish this much and trust the parish to do good with your offerings because your generosity has been breathtaking here! I thank you for your willingness to give! Like I said, the other reasons for such a large margin are that we have been the recipient of several estates, bequests, and gifts. None of this is possible to budget for, so it's hard to have a 'budgeted expense' to spend it on right away. Also, the fish dinner profit is in there, too.

These dollars, though, won't just sit there to accrue to build a net worth – hoarding money is so contrary to the mission of the Church! As I've talked about much with you, with Finance Council, our assets are being given missions and tasks to help us with ministry and the work of the Church today, not just in the future. We have a good architecture in place where we can 'insure' our future parishioners – long and far into the future – so that they will have assets to do the work of the Church in those unknown times and circumstances. But this money we have was given for use today, not just tomorrow. This is why investing for income can assure that we can spend today and save for tomorrow. A lot of this surplus will or have already been transferred into our Parish Endowment. We have a Parish Endowment and a School Endowment (remember, it is from the School Endowment that we are drawing a \$150,000 income for the school). Save for tomorrow and spend today! With savings rates where they have been, we have been able to gobble up a ton of cash flow. But it is not just all savings. I presented to you a list of projects I intend to complete over the coming year (mostly this summer, ideally). One of which was a new audio system for the church. We had a committee get bids and talk to professionals, and we landed on a proposal and company, and will be getting that project underway! That will be an expense, and I don't think we'll have enough excess CSA to draw from by the time we do the work, so this excess income will also be able to pay for that, free and clear! It's all a constant and fluid mix of spend now, save for later, give every dollar a mission! I think that between your generosity and the counsel of our Finance Council, we can do all tremendously!

I won't be here when the last quarter ends and new fiscal year begins, as that will occur over my 30-day retreat this summer. But I hope that this report gives you a sense of clarity of where we are and about where we will be come July 1.

This weekend we celebrate with Deacon Brandon Feikles his ordination to the Diaconate! For a seminarian, the Diaconate is a watershed moment unlike anything else. The Diaconate that Brandon will live is temporary – he is called a Transitional Deacon – but he has now formally conformed his life to Christ in a profound way! He is in a year of so much flux, and newness, and preparation...yet he is only beginning a life of indescribable intimacy with God and he will spend the rest of his life discovering and unfolding why God has called him into this relationship with Him. Pray for Deacon Brandon as he begins this time of much transition, yet something he'll continue into eternity, and keep responding to God in your life with a radical Yes – in whatever way that means and looks to you!
