A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

Heading up to Mundelein Sunday, I had an episode with a recurring brake issue that I was just going to have taken care of when it goes in for inspection next month, but it manifested its roaring presence when I got in a stop and go traffic jam for over an hour. My one brake got very hot, smoke plumed a few times, and some unnerving noise was clamoring from the wheel...as I was in the center of five lanes of bumper-to-bumper traffic. I *love* driving – I *loathe* sitting in traffic! Anyway, I took it to a service shop up here and it needs a bit of work. Since it's brake and caliper work, I was advised I should do those in pairs, so that escalated the work. I had to Uber back to the seminary and I'll have to Uber back tomorrow to pick up my truck! Because I need to leave here Friday morning, I don't have the luxury of calling around for quotes and other opinions – nor do I have all the free time to even do that – so it's sort of just let them do the work! The good news is that I probably added another 2 years of life to the old rust bucket, so you'll be seeing it, yet, for quite a while! They also did a battery test, and I had something like 4% battery life left...? So maybe it was God's Grace that I took it there and they do complimentary tests, because I am not about to find someone to give me a jump along the side of the road in Indiana! As the song goes, Que Sera, Sera!

This week, besides Ubering back and forth to Mavis Tire & Brake, we started our last year of the program, and we are looking at Ignatius' second set of Rules for Discernment, as well as contemplating Christ (and the Priest) as Divine Physician. The bulk of what Ignatius's Rules for Discernment of Spirits is known for is the first set of Rules. The goal of those first Rules is for the Spiritual Director and the one seeking Spiritual Direction to move from sin and an unawareness of God, and into virtue and intimate relationship with God. This movement is characterized by both Consolation (good feelings) and Desolation (unpleasant feelings). Note – being in relationship with God will often go through times of Desolation. Desolation doesn't mean you are away from God, rather that you are being invited to go deeper into that relationship. So, the first set of 14 Rules Ignatius gives us is to help us to properly move towards relationship with God – a relationship that will necessarily involve both desolation and consolation. The enemy is there to pull us away, and we need to know how to mitigate his effects and how to properly combat him so that we can stay in and return to relationship with God. All that, Ignatius also outlines in his first set of Rules.

The Second set of Rules from Ignatius is a little more nuanced and addresses a tactic of the enemy that shows he is a desperate predator. Ignatius, in these set of Rules, advises the Director and the one in direction on how to discern who the Spiritual Consolation is coming from. What Ignatius teaches is that the enemy will use our holiness against us. He will eagerly bait us with seemingly spiritual delights and spiritual progress to eventually, slowly but surely, bit by bit, erode our spiritual health and wellbeing, until we find ourselves in a place we don't recognize nor want to be. In other words, the enemy will manipulate us so that we think we are safe and in the presence of God and what we are doing is good, but, we are being led to be someone or do something or to be victim of something that we have no intention of. This is why Ignatius calls the enemy a predator. This part of the Rules and of Discernment is not always easy because, as Ignatius says, it is like discerning if a single drop of water fell onto a sponge or a stone. The sound of that is nearly indistinguishable unless you really train your ear on it. This set of Rules is not about us becoming paranoid – that is *not* the point! The point in this is that it keeps us in check as to whether we are seeking to please God and serve God and love God above all else. Ignatius contends that if that is and remains our highest good, then that will always defeat any desperate tactic of the enemy. Even though the enemy may latch onto our holy desires initially, if we are seeking to please God, it is a momentary win for him. A consolation from him will always lead us to sin, pride, apathy towards God, a version of ourselves we don't like, etc. But if it is from God, we will always grow in intimacy, mysticism, virtue, holiness, sacrifice, etc.

The enemy will do anything to pull us away from God and rob us of our salvation, so we just need to be vigilant to where we are being led – light or darkness. In the end, though, like a victim of a predator, we are not guilty or less than for being a victim – there is no shame, and we are not less than. It is not our fault a predator exists and wants to harm us. It is not! And like all victims, The Father simply wants to heal the wounds of the heart, soul, and mind – He wants to be our Physician! He will always help us, through Grace, to come back to Him if the enemy is after us, but even if we are harmed by the enemy, it in no way dissipates the Father's love for us, His Beloved Sons and Daughters! Is the enemy real? Yes! Is he clever in tactics? Yes, we saw those tactics on display for those 40 days in the desert! But, as we've also established, they're only tactics fueled by a self-aggrandizement. In the end, we can't wholly interrupt every spiritual feeling or event. All we can do is love and desire God and simply keep running home to the House of the Father! For everything else, Mercy and Grace will tenderly tend to.


