A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

Just a reminder from last week's bulletin for those who are discerning entrance into the Catholic Faith this Easter, please get in touch with me, via email, about your interest in doing so. I will be working with those candidates in that discernment and preparation process. This is for any adult who is either unbaptized or baptized in a non-Catholic tradition (Protestant). Also, for those who were Baptized in the Catholic faith but have never received any other Sacraments, or maybe just have never got Confirmed, reach out and we will take care of that, too! My email is **BKleckner@ERIErcd.org** (I capitalize and lowercase it like that because it is very easy to, and many do, mistype the "eriercd" portion. Written in all lowercase, it's easy to skip a letter). So, anyone in need of Easter Sacraments and / or desiring - or at least discerning - a conversion to the Catholic Faith, it would be an honor to walk you into this profound Truth!

We define ourselves and use the phrase, "*fullness of the faith*" in the Church. This means that others outside the Catholic Tradition can certainly know of God and say prayers to Him...but there is something - well, *a lot* of something - missing, and it's the acquisition or invitation to come into true relationship with God that we can only find in and through the *only* means Our Lord left for us to have that great gift. Think of it this way: you know Fr. Brandon because he came here in the context of your pastor and parish priest. He will and always will be Fr. Brandon to you - and that is beautiful! But you will never know Fr. Brandon and be in relationship with him as a son, a brother, a brother-in-law, an uncle, a grandson, a great-grandson, a classmate, a teammate, a roommate... there is a lack of a fullness in our experience of each other. And it's obviously not just you and I, it's everyone! We are never in a fullness of all relationships with someone - even your spouse! It's just not humanly possible to have that total of relationships with someone. Not only in those roles, but just in the realization that, as Saint Augustine famously penned, we were made for you, O God, and '*our hearts are restless until they rest in thee*'. Our souls were not made to find fullness in only human relationships - regardless of the role or type they may be - but rather, we were made to find what is only possible in God: fully and wholly complete relationship. That is the Catholic Faith! People often ask, 'but don't Protestants believe in the same God? Can't I just pray to God without the mediation of the Church? Can't I find healing from sin because of my faith? And so forth... There is so much resistance, and dare I say, over analyzation and missing the point of the proposition of coming to the fullness of the faith. Many who are in that beautiful place of not sure where to go or where to turn or whether God is really calling them to the Fullness of Relationship with Him are often pulled and jostled by so much noise. I invite them to a calm, contemplative experience of discernment where we can really walk together and witness the Lord gently taking their hand into this intense encounter with all that is Good, True, and Beautiful that they simply won't find anywhere else! It is not a matter of 'can I pray to God from outside the church' or whatever other flurry of thoughts are fluttering within their minds, it's a matter of, 'do you want to enter something with the God of the Universe - the God who created you for intense Love. - that you cannot experience *anywhere* else'? *That*, answering that question is the purpose and journey of the RCIA process and the entire process of conversion into the Fullness of the Faith, or as the Book of Jude so perfectly states, '*the faith which was once for all handed down to the saints* (Jude 1:3)'

For us who are already in this Fullness of both faith and relationship - does it feel like the Fullness? Am I experiencing this full and entire relationship that I can only find with God here in the Church? Lord have mercy, it is hard! This is why we need to be people who remain close to Him, His Sacraments - especially Confession and the Eucharist - our daily Holy Hour (or whatever time we can afford to be with Him), consistently doing works of Charity, engaging in penances and fasts, and overall mimicking our life after the pattern of Christ who desired to hand everything over to His Father. May we live in the perpetual posture of handing our lives over to Christ who takes us to the Father - the source of this Fullness we are restless until we attain and live!

Lastly, I don't have all the details ready as of this printing (I feel like I exist in a perpetual state of being behind nor caught up!), but keep your dinner plans open *Sunday Oct 1*. Our Parish Feast is Friday Sep 29, and I would like to celebrate with a family dinner for all of us that Sunday. I will get the details out to you this week, but just don't make supper plans the night of Oct 1!
