

<u>A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON</u>

Entering, now, the month of October, we enter the final full month of Ordinary Time before we transition into the Season of Advent in late November. October has, for me, over the years, slowly become one of my favorite 'non-liturgical Liturgical Seasons'! Firstly, some of the most fascinating saints have their feasts positioned within October – The North American martyrs, Francis Xavier Seelos, The Guardian Angels, Francis of Assisi, Bruno, Therese, Teresa, JP2, Luke, and Ignatius of Antioch. Then, immediately upon October's end, we are thrust into All Saints & All Souls. Then, we close out with my favorite Sunday of the year, Christ the King! It's a truly holy-saturated eight weeks that takes us from the beginning of Oct to Christ the King. Then you throw into the mix the fact that it's starting to get colder and darker, and the holidays are approaching...this is Father's happy time! I'll have multiple musings over the weeks ahead about what I see are the fruits of this time of year, not the least being that in the coldness and darkness that is becoming more present in our lives this time of year, there is a hearth of deep and penetrating warmth and light that can be found in the Church during these days that lie ahead for us. Let's seek warmth and light from the comforting-warm glow of the saints and the roaring flames of the Sacred Heart which loves us.

With the coming of October, as well, we finish the first quarter of the parish's fiscal year. Shepherding a parish and school requires one to have a mental dexterity for calendars! The parish operates on the following calendars/years – Liturgical Calendar, Academic Year, Church Fiscal Year, School contract year, CSA calendar, and the regular 12-month calendar. None of those align with each other! It is rather silly if you think about it, but its life! What I want to do to keep you more aware of the real numbers is, after each quarter, give you a simple snapshot of total income and total expenditures, year to date, so you can see a more accurate display of the financial wellbeing of the parish, and to keep my stewarding of your resources transparent. I know the offertory section of the bulletin each week shows a budgeted amount and the deficit or surplus we're at. That's not a bad thing, per se, but the church doesn't operate on a fixed 10,500 a week. It's a number derived from dividing the amount of offertory income budgeted by 52 - it's simply there as a point of reference, but there are other sources of income the church uses to operate itself. In addition, the church, in any given week, will either spend more or less than that figure, often drastically so. Obviously. Payroll, assessments, school subsidy, CSA payments, health care costs, etc. are not the same each week, nor are they even paid each week – or month. Next week, I will be able to give you a simple snapshot of Q1 so you can understand the fuller picture.

Lastly with my October musings, the 4:30 Mass on Saturday Oct 22 will be celebrated by Bishop Persico, and it will be my Installation Mass as Pastor. When I got that date arranged with him, I quipped that by the end of October they'll be ready for me to leave, not be installed! Just with the reality of Bishop's schedule and the need to install so many new pastors, it just was the soonest we could get it scheduled. I will have more details for you later, but please plan to attend the Mass that evening, if you can, it would mean a lot to me. I will be having a simple reception over at Lateran Hall after the Mass, so please plan to attend that if you can, as well. Again, I will have a more formal invite for you asap, I'm just behind on that, but I just wanted to alert you to that date and time. Interestingly, though St. Michael and St. Margaret is my second pastorate, this will be my first installation. Back in 2017 when I was made pastor of St. Francis, there was something like almost 30 new pastors announced, and Bishop could simply not commit to all those, so he took away the need for Installations that year, so this will be my first installation, and I hope as many of you are able to come for it.

Okay, I lied, one last thing for the month of October! I will be away a bit this month. I will be on my retreat in Mundelein / Chicago from the evening of Sunday the 16^{th} thru the evening of Friday the 21^{st} . I'm flying via Cleveland. I will need to cancel my Q & A that week (Oct 19). Sorry. I will also have to be away Wednesday October 26^{th} , as that is a diocesan priest gathering, of which I am the chair. Lastly, the weekend of the 29^{th} / 30^{th} I will be away on a trip that I planned way before I knew of the craziness of the preceding two weeks! So, if the last few weeks of this month I look a little frazzled, just remind me to refresh myself from the hearth of the saints during this holy time – keep me accountable to my own words of advice!
