A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

We are hurling our way through this Season of Lent and already find ourselves at Laetare Sunday - the liturgical halfway mark. My hope is that you have, thus far, been able to tap into some Grace that you have greatly needed or that you have been a little more aware of your relationship with God. Perhaps our Sunday reflections on being someone in the eyes of our Father, and not of the world, has been something that has stirred some prayer within you, too. Whatever it has been that has been feeding and sustaining you, I pray it continues through these remaining weeks we have left.

While all of us are trying to make Lent into something spiritual and meaningful - albeit as hard as that may be- there are three in our parish who are preparing for their Easter Sacraments and Full Initiation into The Church: Donna Tenkewich, Jim Hallowell, and Caylee Jayne. It has been an incredible joy, and honor, to have gone through their preparations for the Sacraments. They each have their own 'why' for their yearning to receive Christ and to be imbued into the mystery of The Holy Trinity through a sacramental, liturgical, and grace filled life with a spiritual family - their parish, their church! I have been meeting with each of them individually over the last several months, and now we are coming together a bit more as a group. As a priest, and certainly as a pastor, I have found that this is a truly personal and intimate adventure that they are embarking on, and to right away lump people into a group robs them of their story and ability to grow in their spiritual life in this process. RCIA (rather, OCIA as it's been officially rebranded) is not a class people sign up for, go through a workbook, maybe have homework or assignments, and come each week for lectures or working through a textbook. In my experience, if you want people to disappear after Easter, that formula is your greatest chance at that outcome, especially if that pastor or other parish priest is not integrally part of that process. I said this months ago, but there is no better way to help someone enter the Mysteries of our faith than having them be present at the Mysteries themselves! RCIA - sorry, OCIA - is about getting more excited for, falling more in love with, and building up that anticipation for a lifelong intimacy with the life of The Trinity - not going through a class or acquiring a shelf of knowledge! When OCIA is merely a class, it risks missing the opportunity to really uncover for them why God has called them individually here, what He may be doing in their lives, and where this new intimacy may lead them. It is a great balance to strike that can only be achieved, I feel, if they are deeply rooted in the liturgical rhythm and life of the Church. What I have loved about this year, is that all three of them are weekly engaging in the liturgical life of our parish and of the Church and love it! We meet to talk about God, theology, church history, Scriptures, for sure, but they are preparing for a lifelong adventure and relationship that no class or book can ever prepare them for! It is only something The Spirit can facilitate and engulf within their hearts - and ours! I cannot wait to Confirm them and give them, for the first time, The Body and Blood of their God! Few things match the joy of that in the life of a priest! As Donna, Jim, and Caylee are eagerly and intentionally preparing for their sacraments at Easter, let us use these remaining weeks of Lent to reinvigorate our appetite for Grace, Sacraments, and Divine Mystery! Let us prepare to partake of The Eucharist as if it is our first time at Easter, so that when the Paschal Festivities arrive, we - with them - may receive in a way unlike any other!
