Teaching Kids to Be Smart About Social Media: There are plenty of good things about social media – but also many risks and things kids and teens should avoid. Mean behavior is not OK. 2.) Think twice before hitting "enter". Remind them that what they post can be used against them. 3.) Use privacy settings. 4.) Don't "friend" strangers. If you don't know them, don't friend them. 5.) Teach kids not to share anything on social medial that they wouldn't want their teachers, college admissions officers, future bosses – and even gramma – to see. A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

I think I told this story last year, but, with the Feast this week, I enjoy sharing how Our Lady of Guadalupe became for me a meaningful feast and title of Mary. Growing up and even through seminary, I really had no devotion to Our Lady, nor did anyone ever really show me or teach me. I remember that in Kindergarten, we received plastic rosaries and prayed, I think, a decade, and I didn't pick up a rosary again till my first night in seminary some thirteen years later. Then that rosary (which they gifted us, one blessed by Pope Benedict XVI) was put away in a little keepsake box I have, along with that old plastic one from kindergarten, never to really be prayed with again. (I still have both somewhere, but in my move here last year, I misplaced that small box. I know it's somewhere...maybe one day, when I move out, I'll find it)! It wasn't that I didn't like or think of or know or go to Mary, it was just that that relationship lacked any typical 'Catholic structure'. I remember, especially throughout seminary, thinking that I would really need to get better at this Mary thing before Orders because all these guys are praying, with great devotion, to our Lady, and I simply did not have that in my arsenal, my spiritual repertoire. I simply was neither shown nor taught how to pray and, truly, why bother praying, in that way. My spiritual life might have looked amorphous to most and when I compared it to others, I just felt like I lacked or was insufficient. For as central as prayer and helping others pray has become to my identity over the years, I hardly recognize that old version of Brandon, and yet, at the same time, he seems so familiar. It was not until a year or two into my priesthood that I found my personal connection I had been searching for to Our Lady - and a link I was missing and needing in my spiritual life.

It was the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, and I was giving, admittedly, a canned Marian homily because I just didn't have any personal connection to the Feast or had a spiritual intimacy with Her that would have made sense to anyone in the pew. But as I was preaching, something hit me - I just felt this complicated and profound insight giving birth in my mind as I was droning on. After Mass, I spent some time in prayer and it fully gave birth in my heart and mind: Mary is pregnant with The Word in that most beautiful of images of Our Lady, and all she wants is to give birth to Him - She wants to give birth to The Word into the world...and so do I! I found in Her icon emblazoned upon St Juan's tilma a lady who loves being pregnant but would love even more to give birth and have that child of Hers - the Word - run free and wild throughout the world, and I wanted to participate in that birth of The Word into the world. I wanted to be someone that was, too, pregnant with The Word through prayer and study, and then give birth to The Word - Christ - to all hearts, minds, and souls. I saw in Her, me; I saw in Her desire, my desire; I saw in Her, my priesthood. From that day forward, not only Marian devotion and prayer made sense, but I was given a share in Her life and mission. I feel that every aspect of my Priesthood and my Sonship is an extension of Her Motherhood and Daughterhod. One of the greatest experiences of my life was being able to go down to Mexico City (with my sister who is a Spanish teacher) and spending some time at the shrine praying, celebrating Mass, taking in the beauty and the grandeur of the grounds, and just uniting our hearts together in this common mission and desire of just bringing Her Son - Our Saviour and Love - into the world through giving birth to Him in the hearts, minds, and souls of all His beloved. (I would recommend a visit down there to anyone. It's an easy and quick trip to make and the city really is beautiful, huge, and safe. The area around the shrine is loud and very busy, but there is a serenity that exists on the grounds of the shrine. It's probably the quickest and easiest trip you can make to a major Marian shrine).

Allow this Season of Advent to engender within your soul an urge to, alongside Our Lady, give birth to Christ into the world. Obviously, not a physical birth (I spoke about this before, and someone after a Mass accused me of saying men can have babies, and I never saw them again...), but a spiritual birth. Let us become pregnant (again, metaphor) with The Word through our prayer, study, and worship, and then desire to birth that Word - Christ - into the lives of others through our sharing of the Gospel, The Truth and The Beauty of our faith which we boldly and joyfully profess!
