

A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

Thank you to those who attended the Q&A the other week. I was glad so many came and that we had a great time and conversation! I will be moving future Q&A gatherings to the Large Meeting Room. The acoustics in the church are just not conducive to having conversations, so in the name of ease of listening, we'll meet in the large meeting room so we can all hear – I'll set it up appropriately for our gatherings. Again, those are the 1^{st} and 3^{rd} Wednesdays, Sep thru Nov, 7 pm – 8 pm. All are invited! I also want you to remember that the parish now offers an additional confession time of 8 PM to 8:30 PM every Tuesday evening. Confession can be hard and scary, and for those reasons, many tend to stay away. Something that has helped me in my own preparation for the Sacrament and overcoming the fear and anxiety that often attaches itself to the experience of going to confession, is the reminder that I am not explaining myself and my sin to Father, rather, I am admitting, out loud, to Christ my guilt for the sins I have committed. What this means is that Father is there as a physical presence of Christ, just as he is for all the other Sacraments, so we should speak to the priest as we are speaking to Christ. To dig a bit deeper, this means that Christ already knows your sin, the guilt of your heart, and the contrition you desire. You do not need to convince Father of that, nor do you have to explain and paint the picture of everything to him either as if he's a detective investigating a crime! You are not talking to Brandon, but to Christ! Speak to the priest as you would to Christ. The sacrament is there to admit and express both guilt and contrition, not to explain to Father the details! Why? Because Christ knows the details already, he knows the back story, he knows the people involved, all He wants is to hear you say is that you have sinned and desire to be made anew! If Father has a question or would like to sit with something for a bit, then talk to him. Again, he is acting in the place of Christ, so if Christ would counsel on a certain sin, then let Father do that. The point is, all we need to bring to confession is the name of the sin we are guilty of and a sorrowful and contrite heart. Personally, I have found that this eases so many of my nerves because I don't have the obligation to accurately tell Father every nuance – it doesn't matter to him, and Christ already knows! It also frees us of the temptation to tell a story about our sin to Father that somehow downplays the sin or perhaps even legitimizes it in a way. None of us want to be seen as bad. Since our human inclination is to make ourselves sound good, we can easily exaggerate a bit in the story to make ourselves feel better and paint a more positive picture of ourselves to Father. When this happens, though, our sorrow and contrition begin to wane and extinguish because, well, we aren't bad, we're good! Or, if we feel we have to painstakingly tell every detail, we may be too ashamed of some of those details and just never bring up the sin or go to confession in the first place! Do not fall into the trap of the enemy of explaining ourselves. Don't! God knows you, just say what you did! Period. The other temptation of ours in the context of confession, and one that can derail and overpower our authentic examination of conscience, is the temptation to categorize our sin. Scrupulosity knows no better friend than categorization and labeling of sin! Please, unshackle yourselves from those chains and run from that prison guard who wants to keep you in those! Yes, there is such a thing as venial sin and there is a thing as mortal sin. Yes, you were taught correctly, mortal sin can very much keep you out of Heaven, and so you want to keep your soul free of those wounds. The problem is that a mind and heart overly fixated on the category of sin begins to - not always immediately, but most often will eventually - think of Salvation and Mercy and Atonement and Grace as all entirely contingent on the latest category of sin on your soul, and this is not the teaching of the Church! An unhealthy examination and an unhealthy and inaccurate understanding of Christ's Church can arise when we begin to believe that every sin somehow cancels out the work of God. In the name of piety, so many assume heretical or unorthodox ideas and assumptions. Yes, sin is real and has consequences. Just read the first sentences of Scripture! But, at no time did man's sin ever extinguish the powerful Love and Mercy of God, nor the cosmic nature of the Atonement that He exercised! If there is sin, simply confess it. Our Lord simply desires to heal us and to give us the ointment and medicine of His Mercy and Grace. He's the physician, simply tell him your symptoms, all of them, and He will prescribe the treatment you need for the healing of your sin-sick soul. Let Him be the Divine Physician, don't do His job for Him by analyzing and categorizing your symptoms! Take these two perspectives – the need to simply speak to Christ and that all He wants is to heal us – and let them bring a bit more clarity to your examination and preparation for the sacrament. A good examination each night is crucial for our spiritual health and wellbeing. If we don't know where we are ill, we can't let ourselves be healed by the Divine Physician and be made holy. Also, let these principles give you a bit more ease and freedom to really make the sacrament, and your own reflection on your sin, an intense and intimate encounter with Christ who has the medicine to make you whole, a medicine He acquired through a journey to Hell! These, I have found, have helped me to make better examines and more fruitful confessions; I hope they do the same for you.


