**A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON**

John the Baptist, John the Forerunner, Holy Prophet, the Angel of the Desert; no matter what you call him, there is no mistaking the holy saint's authoritative place in this holy season. John is a complex figure and one that often seems elusive, both to the scholar and the mystic. From even the womb, John leaped for joy at the presence of Christ and, from a young age, he lived an ascetical life out in the Judean desert in utter obscurity. Like with Christ, we don't have recorded in the pages of Scripture the details of his youth and upbringing. What we are given is the account of his parents, Elizabeth and Zechariah, praying for the gift of a child, and his father being silenced by Archangel Gabriel for his disbelief in the prophetic words of the Messenger. This whole scene in the Temple is remarkable and prefigures the Annunciation six months later when Gabriel will make a visit north to see Mary about the miraculous birth of her son. We then see the birth of the Forerunner, and that is about it until he emerges on the scene wearing camel hair and eating turnips and bugs! How John goes from a baby in the hills of Galilee to that charismatic figure is lost to history and left to both tradition and speculation. There are many theories, traditions, and stories about his early life that swirl around out there – you can latch on to whatever you want, there's nothing inherently good or bad about any of them, but what I want to latch onto for the sake of this holy season of Advent is that fact that his childhood must've metamorphosed his spirit, his soul, his nous, his intellect. How does he end up being and doing what he ends up being and doing?! Again, you can ascribe any number of stories to his youth and early adulthood, but what goes without saying is that John becomes the Angel of the Desert not by mistake or happenstance, but through profound desire and yearning for the God of the universe to reveal Himself to John and John uniting himself to each and every revelation.

In the opening sentences of the Gospel of Saint John, John gives a deep and peering insight into who The Forerunner was, for Saint John says of John the Baptizer, "he was not the Light, but he came to bear witness to the Light". Just sit with that remarkable verse for a moment and let that sink deep within. The Baptizer came not to be anything, but to point to something; he was not here to be a light but to show others the Light. Repeating the above statement, John does not become what he became through accident, he becomes the final Prophet of the Old Covenant because he chose to decrease so that The Light could increase; John chose to become nothing so that Christ could become everything! Repeating what I said above, we do not know every detail of his life, but it's not important to, ultimately, because what we receive is what is important. What we receive is that this man chose to abandon the pursuits of the flesh and the earthly life for the pursuit of The Light, The Logos, The Christ! We can say that his life, for whatever details composed his daily existence, was a decades-long Advent! He lived in expectation, longing, and waiting. The Baptizer, embarking on his own ministry of preaching and baptizing, was only operating from the place that made the most sense. He was not someone of the world – by all accounts, he clearly shunned the norms and expectations placed upon him. When it was time to make that decision of what he would do with the remainder of his life, it only made sense that he follow that Love that carried him through, perhaps, decades in the desert and wilderness. This obscure and rather elusive man was a true mystic in that his entire existence was imbued in a mystery of Light and Divinity that he simply couldn't get enough of and was never fully satisfied. He was never full, the cup always had room for more of this Light and Love that he sought with every sinew of his being. This is Advent! This is the way our lives should look all fifty-two weeks, not simply these four.

I believe the hardest thing about living the Christian life isn't prayer or trying to live moral lives. We all know right and wrong, and we all have at least a basic or instinctive infrastructure of prayer and we know that there are spiritual fathers in the Church to help us grow in that. What is most difficult, at least from my perspective, is that we fail to resist those cultural and societal norms and expectations. Christianity is not meant to be a cultural accoutrement. The Kingdom was never advertised as the place where we have all the politicians and laws that we think are right and just. No, it was always a place of suffering because the world is broken and fallen. The Kingdom is that place where we suffer and strive together and walk with each other in holiness to the Heavenly Jerusalem! That is the hardest part of the Christian life, and what I think the Angel of the Desert reminds us to work harder on! Advent is that time when we disengage with the world and long for and desire that Holy Light. That Light is there to bring meaning to our sufferings, to embolden us to preach and give witness, and strengthen us to carry the crosses of others to assist them on this august journey of life! As we delve deeper and deeper into this season, let us realize how *normal* Advent should be for the rest of the forty-eight weeks of the year!
