

#### <u>A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON</u>

One of the most asked questions of the Bible, I have found, is why it appears as if there are two Gods within its pages: The God of the Old Covenant (Testament), and the God of the New. The Old Covenant is wrought with bloody wars and unimaginable sins – sins that make you squirm when you read them, and things mentioned that you wouldn't let your children read! Then, amid this depraved world, there is a god who appears to be a weary, underpaid, disgruntled floor manager trying to discipline his employees and make the company run smoothly, but he's super stressed and lashes out at them, and then that makes the employees more inefficient, and it is just this endless feedback loop! Then, you turn a few pages, and voila, here's a big bear hugging Jesus who just wants to love on us and make us all holy saints! He even sits and eats with us, laughs with us, and forms deeprooted friendships with us. How in the world are these the same people?! If you have ever felt or thought about that, you are in good company, and it means that you are someone who cares enough to notice the nuances between the Covenants. Before we reflect upon this, it is imperative to realize that there is no single and simple answer to this – you really must take the Scriptures as a whole to see the present seamlessness of the "two gods", but for our purposes, we will take a ride down just one avenue. To get to the core of this answer is to look at the reality for those people in the pages of the Old Covenant. From the moment of Adam and Eve's grand entrance into the pages of human history with their dumb sin, humanity was doomed to be separated from God. We see that visually in the early pages of Genesis when there is a physical distancing and hiding from man and God in the Garden, and it just accelerates from there. You can think of it as a continual expansion of that distance between man and God. This distancing, though, isn't God's doing, it's ours! By the very nature of God being out of reach from man, all man really knows is an absence and distancing, and when that happens, even to us, we're left completely open and vulnerable to the enemy and the ways of sin and debauchery. Because heaven was sealed off because of sin, all they really knew, in a way, was their sin and their capacity for sin. By sin, not only do we mean the bad stuff they could accomplish in this life, but also the lethal and damning consequences of that sin - death! Everyone who lived and died before the Resurrection, even if they were the holiest of prophets or humblest of paupers, was doomed to an eternity in Hell! There was no escaping Hell! Adam to Moses to Sarah to David - Hell! Now, there is a whole other discussion on the nature of Hell, especially before the Passion, but it can be understood, roughly, that there were two chambers of Hell: Gehenna and Sheol. One was for the place of the damned, the other the place of the righteous. When Our Lord descends into Hell, it can be understood that He went to Sheol to retrieve the righteous waiting for their redemption. Again, a whole other discussion for another day – or ask me at Q&A! Anyway, those people, the best they could hope for was Hell, and even if you were in Sheol, the good Hell, you were still separated from God and undergoing the effects of that. This reality, articulated and understood differently by different periods and classes of Israelites throughout the centuries, was the underpinning and foundation for so much despairing sin in those pages.

With that, these Israelites are then trying to reach out to a God who is ever more distanced from them, trying to reach out to Him on their journey to Hell, and this results in a very imperfect relationship and encounter with Him whenever it does arise. Most notably, throughout those pages, we see prophets acting as emissaries from God to a fallen people, and these prophets were not the most blissful people! Their lives were rough, tough, and filled with persecution and trial because of their vocation. No doubt that added punch and emphasis to what they said! As I said above, there are so many dimensions to this question and it really is asking a lot about the text of Holy Scripture, the nature of God, the effects of the Fall, the science of Sin and Grace, and the nature of the Atonement. All of those deserve the dignity of long and didactic discussions to fully envelop what is happening, but for our limited space, we will take the above as an overarching context. Now, in the New Covenant, God has finally breached that gap between Him and us, and there is almost a sense of relief that now He can finally cure and heal us! The joy, the laughter, the deep relationships we see Our Lord brim over with are what He desired to experience with us for centuries, and it was all building up within Him as a cosmic desire to be with His beloved! Now, finally, He has His children back again (technically, after the Resurrection, but He's here on Earth finally, in the flesh, and He is moments from the grand finale). What we need to take away from this is that God was barreling toward us as we were distancing from Him. He was like the galloping gazelle hastily running through the dense forest in pursuit of its lover (Song of Songs). After unknown years since Adam, this God that never stopped looking and reaching out for His people has finally found His children, and like the Father of the prodigal, He finally embraces them after so long apart! As I said at the outset, this is one of the most asked, and most faceted of questions in all of Scripture. But to begin to understand the textual nuances of God between the two Covenants, we need to understand the nature of those people and the nature of God. Only when we begin to see and understand those aspects can we see the living and loving God who has never changed, but only got nearer and nearer to us as we approached the day of our Salvation! Whatever our questions may be or wherever we get puzzled by the Word of God, may we never lack in seeing a pursuing God who runs through history and into Hell to retrieve us for all eternity!


