A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

We've come out of the Easter Season and, once again, find ourselves back in the Season of Ordinary Time. We will remain in this season until the First Sunday of Advent, Dec 3. I love the Season of Ordinary Time because it allows us to swim through such a diverse ecosystem of Scriptures, ideas, themes, and facets of our ultimate destiny found in union with Christ. The other seasons are wonderful for what they offer, but Ordinary Time offers just so much. This weekend is Trinity Sunday, next is Corpus Christi, but after that, our Sundays return to the Ordinary Time Lectionary readings, though our daily readings returned to Ordinary Time this past week. We have many beautiful things to explore together this Summer and Fall in these weeks of Ordinary Time, so buckle up and get your hearts and minds ready!

This Sunday, Trinity Sunday, is a Feast that is less about an event, and more about a Theology. Or another way to think of it is that today is God's Feast Day! It is a theology of the Church that went through many growing pains in the ancient Christian world. The content of the early councils of the Church were addressing the question of who Christ is. But, to know who Christ is, you need to first understand who Christ is in relationship to The Father, and then, of course, The Holy Spirit. The exact language of this relationship and theology are not spelled out in the words of Holy Scripture. The evidence is certainly there, everywhere, but the Scriptures lack the word 'Trinity', and thus much debate ensued and heresies arose in those early centuries. Our language for how we talk about the Trinity is the fruit of Greek Philosophy. I tend to believe that The Father chose the time He did to send Christ into the world because, to some degree, He understood that the people of that time were intellectually engaged enough to do the heavy work of discerning the theology of this Church, and of God's identity. Christ came at a time when there was an incredible infrastructure for searching for truth, Greek Philosophy. This is not to say that every citizen of the ancient world was versed in Socrates, Plato, and Aristotle – but a lot were! Our world today lacks a deep appreciation for the minds of our ancient intellectual forebearers. We live in a world – primarily in the West - that is still suffering the open and festering wounds of the Age of Enlightenment that spilled into Marxism and Darwinism, which plowed into the carnage of thought that took the world into two world wars and untold genocide, which aptly saw a reaction through just a dismantling of any kind of true philosophical engagement by the masses. Today, Philosophy is thought of as a worthless degree or a pastime of someone lonely and who has an aggrandized sense of themselves! Rather, in the ancient world and through the Middle Ages and into the Renaissanceand beyond, philosophy was simply how we did the work of finding truth. Philosophy and Theology went hand in hand and wasn't reserved for just a select few, but it was the collective work of the society to go in search of truth and a best path forward for the flourishing of both life and faith. This general sense of familiarity with philosophy and a hunger for transcendental truths, allowed the early Christians to engage in the deep work of taking the Holy Words of Scripture and passing them through the lens of Greek Philosophy and they gave for us language to talk about the Trinity! Without the Greeks and their contribution to Philosophy – particularly Plato – it's unclear how we would've arrived at the intellectual language we have about The Trinity. So, to my earlier point before my rant – I am one who believes that God's timing was intentional, and an aspect of that intentionality is that He knew then – and not now – His children would be able to give language to His deeper Truths and thus, articulate an accurate and beautiful theology of who He is! May we, then, be people who love and hunger and go in search of Truth and realize that our world today is not set up for that! For all the advancements we have made in technology and the physical sciences, we really have dissolved the cultural and collective intellect of our society! Broadly speaking, the most powerful and elite in our society today are intellectually inferior to a first century fisherman along the Mediterranean or a teenage student learning rhetoric in second century Alexandria. We really have regressed as a people. Be different! As we celebrate the triumph of this theology of the Most Holy Trinity, let us realize that It is a gift to us from God who revealed these truths in a time when people could make sense of it. Let us thank God that everything He does has a reason, mission, and purpose!
