BEWARE OF GROOMING BEHAVIOR

Children and young people can be groomed online or in the real world, by a stranger or by someone they know. This could be a family member, a friend or someone who has targeted them – like a teacher, faith leader or sports coach. Grooming is when someone builds a relationship, trust and emotional connection with a child or young person so they can manipulate, exploit, or abuse them. Grooming can take place over a short or long period of time. Some common tactics are pretending to be younger, giving advice or showing understanding, buying gifts, giving attention, taking them on trips, outings, or holidays. To prevent your child from grooming behavior, teach them about healthy relationships, how to stay safe online, and who are the trusted adults they can go to for help. A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

This is our last weekend of our current weekend Mass schedule. For a final reminder, Saturday is remaining the same, as well as our 11 AM on Sunday. The only change that is happening is blending the 7 and 9 into an 8 AM. That is it. One hour. It was the least disruptive solution I could find. The fact is that there is no one priest parish in the diocese that has four weekend Masses - there are none! Why? Because we're not supposed to! Parishes that need four or more Masses have at least two priests available for that coverage. I looked - the largest parish in our Diocese is Our Lady of Peace in Erie. It is easily a parish triple our size. They presently have only one more mass than us - and they have three priests on staff! It's just the reality. Another factor to consider is that with the current Mass schedule, we have a seating capacity of approximately 1,800 people between the four Masses. Annually, we take a head count at each Mass in October. This past year, in our October count, we averaged only 390 people for the entire weekend between all four Masses. Simply, The Church dissuades a Mass schedule of four weekend Masses for 390 people when there is no serious reason otherwise. Don't get me wrong, I am not a downer - I am thrilled with that count in that it shows there is a return of many coming out of the pandemic era. I think we are a steadily growing and thriving parish, but not a parish that needs four weekend masses(for one guy to cover). Also, we have two church buildings so I need to create a schedule where I can have a reasonable number of Masses for two buildings, and we just need to adapt to the change that is simply happening in our Diocese. We have fewer priests operating like it's the 1990's. That may be nostalgic (I'm a 90's kid through and through), but it is not sustainable. I'll be real, by that last Mass on Sundays, I'm yawning more than I feel I should while leading the prayer of the Mass. It was told to me that you had envisioned you would have fewer priests in the future, and a motivation for your renovation about twenty years ago was to make the church large enough so you could accommodate fewer Masses when the day came when you had fewer priests. When I look around at my brother priests and what they are dealing with in their parts of the diocese and our fellow Catholics in the Diocese who have lost their parish or church building or a full-time pastor all together over recent years because of the changes of personnel and parishioners...it just makes our one-hour change seem like a luxury! Let's never stop praying for more vocations to the priesthood and being all on the same team, and all hands-on deck, as time moves on, as we need to become increasingly flexible with the challenges that lie ahead.

With our new 8AM at Saint Margaret Church, the music ministry is unable to schedule a regular cantor or pianist at this time. In the meantime, I would welcome anyone who wishes to cantor acapella or those who would be open to playing the piano (or any instrument) at Saint Margaret to volunteer to do so as they are available. I am not an advocate of a consistent lack of music at a Sunday Liturgy - it's the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection and the highest worship we can do and are created for! Music is prayerful and it's supernal worship. So, we will make do till we can get regular music scheduled at that Mass, but in the meantime, if anyone would like to step up and play or cantor at any of those Masses, please, you are welcome!

This week begins The Season of Lent. I have for you those daily devotionals again, so please take them and use them if they will help with your daily prayer throughout. Just a note - we will be having our annual Fish Dinners, but we will not begin this week, but next week. The Knights have a game dinner scheduled and it conflicts with having a fish dinner this week. We will begin them next week, the second Friday of Lent. Please share that news with people you know that comes to those dinners so they aren't surprised if they inadvertently come this week. Also, use these next few days before Ash Wednesday to consider deeply and deliberately what you most need to do to straighten up, rehab, or build up your spiritual life. Lent is a nice long season to give some needed attention to your life with God. I know I need to use these weeks to give attention to a few areas - don't miss the Grace of the Season!
