A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

Whenever I envision what an ideal parish is and what the life of a parish ought to be, what I overwhelmingly come to is that, firstly, the parish should be a place of incredibly fulfilling and astonishingly beautiful Liturgy where Heaven profoundly kisses Earth, where each of us realizes that we've engaged the supernatural and mystical! Secondly, I also land on the fact that a parish should be the 'Font of Truth' for a community. A parish needs to cultivate a Culture of Catechesis where at any given moment, the parish is offering some opportunity to nurture the mind and the soul. Therefore, I believe that Catholic Education in our Catholic Schools is a noble and vital ministry of any parish blessed enough to have it! I have come to think of Catholic Schools as the δ^{th} Sacrament. With that, a strong Faith Formation program is also essential so all the children of our parish can come to know the depths and intricacies of their faith and Church. In addition to those two primary ministries for our young people, it is also imperative for the parish to serve the spiritual and intellectual needs of the adults of the parish. One of my goals as your pastor is to offer opportunities for formation in as many settings and contexts as possible. I plan to offer things seasonally and update on new opportunities every few months. This is a parish where, gratefully, we already have things happening, so we're not starting from scratch! I would just like to really build on it and encourage you all to take advantage of whatever you can and whenever you can— I never want someone to feel locked in; life happens. I also desire to never charge a dime for anything that we do! From St Michael School to an evening adult class and everything in between – it is my mission as pastor to master the stewardship of our parish, so every moment of ministry is available to everyone at the smallest cost possible! The school and Faith Formation have tuition and fees involved at present, but I will be working to bring all those down as far to zero as soon as possible (I already have about 7 spreadsheets going where I am figuring out how to accomplish all that! You have a nerdy pastor!). I just wholly believe that that is what the Offertory is there for and why we have investments and gifts and fundraisers – it's to pay to do Church! Ok...I am passionate about this, so I will end my rant, but you will be, God willing, seeing the fruit of that passion as time goes on. My role as steward of your treasures is sacred. In the meantime, here are some opportunities for Adult Faith Formation starting soon. *That Man is* You will be starting up on September 15 and will meet weekly, Thursday mornings, from 6:00 AM-7:20 AM in McElhinny Hall. We start with some much-needed coffee and donuts, watch a short video, then have some discussion and are out the door in time for guys to get to work or back home to get the kids ready for school

or whatever your early morning routine. I'm excited to have learned about this program which aims at strengthening men as leaders in the world and their families, as well as within the Church. I am anxious for this one to start, and I plan to attend each week with the with the guys! Deacon Frank will be starting up a series on the Blessed Mother put out by the St. Paul Institute on Tuesday evenings from 6:30-8 beginning October 4th. It will run for 6 weeks till Advent, then pick back up in January and finish by Lent. Deacon Frank will need a rough number of how many plan to commit to the entire course as there are some materials for him to purchase, but please know you can come whenever – Deacon Frank will have enough materials. Thirdly, I will be having something I came to do a lot, and loved, while in Clearfield, and that is a Q & A on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month, from September through November. Let's make it 7 - 8 PM. All this will be is open questions and answers – ask me anything! I love to be asked questions about the faith and the Church, so whatever you bring, I will do my best to answer! We'll start with a little lesson from me on whatever is on my mind, and then open it up for questions! Some fun and random conversations can break out in these settings, so if nothing else, come for some entertainment! These are just three things I'd just like to put on your radar right now. Both the men's group and the Mary study will have more information out, so look for that. Ultimately, if we are going to set the world on fire as Our Lord desires, then we are going to have to encounter Him in Liturgy and in the deep reflection of His Truth through study, conversation, and prayer. A Culture of Catechesis is something I desire to labor to build up here, and I pray many will labor beside me. guys!
