

A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

I mentioned last week in my homily the interview between actor Shia LaBeouf and Bishop Robert Barron from Word on Fire Ministry. If you haven't yet watched that, I still recommend it, especially if you are familiar with both Shia's acting and his troubled personal life. What strikes me most about that eighty-minute exchange between the two is LaBeouf's utter vulnerability about his sin, yes, but also about his openness to God working on him. LaBeouf doesn't come to God because someone sold him an idea nor because he was given a catechism to read - he comes to a deep and life-changing faith in God and His Holy Church because he experienced it! Shia didn't read the latest printout from the bishops editorializing on some socio-political happening, but he read the Gospels, learned the Rosary, engaged in joyful brotherhood, and imbued himself in the Liturgy. That is it! He simply lived the life we are all created and called to within the Church – and it worked! I think that the greatest obstacle for so many to come to faith, or to grow deeper into it, is that we tend to assume we need to acquire a cacophony of tools. Rather, the reality that we so often forget is that God gave us all the tools – Scripture and Liturgy in particular – to grow and deepen our faith. Our Lord and Our Father and The Spirit do not and have never left us abandoned as orphans foraging in the streets – we are wonderfully designed and redeemed, all we need to simply do is accept it through living a life within the halls of Holy Church. For me, that little interview reassured my own mind and heart that the Word of God and the Worship of God are enough! Let those two be enough for you, too. What I think this interview also shines a light on is that people are terribly hungry for God! They are not hungry for, as Mr. LaBeouf puts it, car salesmen, but real and authentic encounters with the Divine, with something entirely other than themselves and not of this world. Saint Augustine puts it so well when he famously reflected on the restlessness of our hearts and how the world simply will never assuage, but only by encountering the Living God through which that God gave us - Liturgy, Scripture, Sacraments, Grace – can we ever still the restlessness and quiet the noise. When we look at this weekend's Gospel, we see the Lord teaching about a particular kind of intentionality where life isn't executed or won through haphazard means and luck. The Lord uses the analogies of constructing a tower and leading an army into battle. To construct a strong and sturdy tower that will support the weight of its contents and occupants, you need to mind a lot of attention to mounds of details and minutia to assure that tower is what it needs to be. Just some mortar and stone, with a dash of luck and a prayer, is not going to give you a tower that is, not just functional, but safe. Similarly, to lead an army into a battle – and win – you need to be intricately adept at the various arms, armored vehicles, weaponry, planes, etc. at your disposal.

You also need to understand the competency of your soldiers – are they trained, do they also know how to handle the arms and weaponry, can they read maps, etc.? Just having your Rifle Merit Badge and some luck and prayer will prevent you from even approaching the battle, let alone winning it. To do intricate and complicated things, you need to have intricate and complicated skills and tools. That is simply the law that governs reality and the world we live in. Why would the Lord speak to us about this and what is the bigger point? Well, going back to Mr. LaBeouf's interview about his conversion to the true faith, we see that what made that conversion so profound and powerful was that he used and employed intricate and complicated skills and tools. He surrounded himself with Grace, Liturgy, and Scripture! The stuff of this world cannot lead to the heights and the victories we long for and know we were made to partake in. They ultimately won't. To build the tower, to win the war, to come to faith, we need to know what works and what doesn't. This lesson, from Our Lord, is one that serves us well as we strive to make sense of faith in our lives and watch it actualize and grow before us. I think another thing to take away from that interview is that his newfound faith is incredibly fresh and raw, and he will be greatly challenged to maintain that and have it grow deeper and deeper roots in him. Sin is still real for him, and the demons still desire his demise. Just because someone so public has a conversion like that does not mean they are finally a saint and it's easy sailing from here. He, like all of us, is and will be challenged in our faith. We are and will be tempted to despair and give up hope and only see the broken ugliness of so much and so many around us. As we pray for Mr. LeBeouf and his continued strengthening of faith, may we realize that all of us, right here, also need to support and love one another as we intentionally employ the tools at our disposal for encountering the divine so our faith may not falter, but be set ablaze!




